Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

Each day that passes, it feels like we can't avoid hearing stories of increased hate and fear. Truthfully, it can feel overwhelming. And yet, each week, we are commanded to stop.....and take a moment to pause, to be present and to look around at the blessings in our world. It's extremely difficult to celebrate shabbat during these times, but it's something we need. We need to be reminded that no matter what else is going on, we are surrounded by natural beauty and awe.



I know that one moment that helps me realize this in a deep way is Shabbat at the Beach. We stand and sit on the sand, hearing the ebb and flow of the ocean, while smelling the salty air. We can't help feeling the wind flow – as we try to hold onto our prayer packets, while we sing, pray and rejoice.

For me this moment is spiritual, joyous and wonderful. It's an opportunity to get out of the house and connect with our outside world. And more than that, it is holy beyond words. And don't take just my word for it, consider some perspectives of my colleagues who express their sacred connections to the outdoors through a Jewish viewpoint.

Rabbi Jaime Korngold, the Adventure Rabbi says, "It's quite possible that God tried to talk to Moses in the city. But with all the distractions of everyday life-the noise of the marketplace, the dust from the caravans, and his friends saying hello as he passed by-Moses didn't notice God's call. So, too, when we are off the grid in wilderness, we have the time to slow down and notice God opportunities."

Certainly, having Shabbat at the beach is just one of those opportunities.

Rabbi Mike Comins cites a polish born theologian, and activist of the 20th century, Rabbi Heschel. He notes that, "Abraham Joshua Heschel writes, 'Awe precedes faith; it is at the root of faith. We must grow in awe in order to reach faith. Awe rather than faith is the cardinal attitude of the religious Jew.' Wilderness is the everyday gateway to awe. Heschel was famous for beginning a lecture: 'I've just seen a miracle, I've just seen a miracle! I saw the sunset.'"

Seeing the sunset over the water is particularly full of awe. Rabbi Owen Gottlieb writes specifically about his experience at a shabbat on the Beach saying, "Years ago, I attended my first Shabbat on the Beach service with the Malibu Jewish Center and Synagogue. As the sun set, we lit candles and began to sing the bracha (blessing). Just moments into our singing, dolphins broke water offshore. I was in awe. I learned that the dolphins had become part of the Shabbat on the Beach ritual; whenever the singing started, the dolphins greeted the worshippers.

That night, praying Maariv Aravim, the prayer for the God who brings on evenings, gave new meaning to my contemplations of God, who sets the constellations in the heavens, rolls light from darkness at dusk-and sets the dolphins in the ocean amid the waves.

Whenever we're awed by beauty, we can raise our thoughts to contemplate the Divine Source of awe."

We sadly won't be seeing dolphins at our Shabbat at the Beach, but that doesn't change our moments of true holiness – instances that are unique and special to us. We have the sounds of children running to the playground, soulful music, and the waves and birds. And most importantly a shared time of holiness when we need it most.

I hope that you'll join us this year to celebrate Shabbat at the Beach on July 11th at 6:30 pm at Sayville Marina Park, complete with birthday and anniversary blessings for the month of July. And if you aren't able to attend, maybe take a moment to step outside and feel the magic and Godliness of summer; we can all use a little extra awe in our lives.

Supermarket and pharmacy cards are especially welcome and are an easy way to help people.

SUMMER HEBREW CLASSES

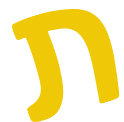

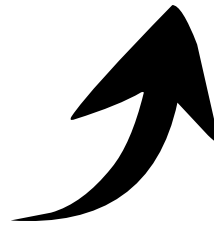
Through our first six games we've banked just over \$8,000 in commissions and tips and are on track to reach our budget objective of \$20,000 by September.

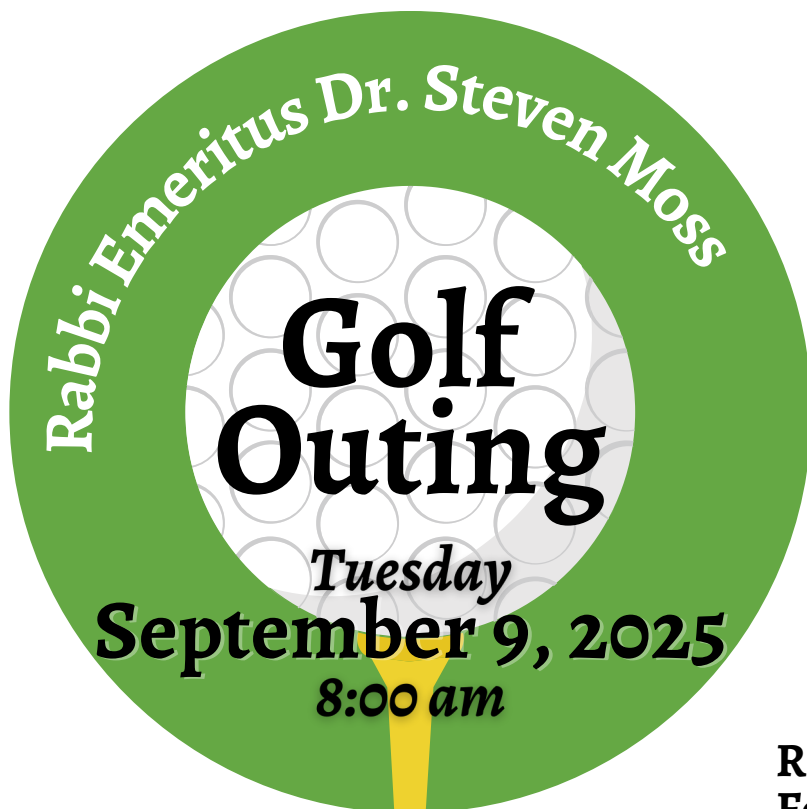


Dynamic Chair Yoga with Bonnie Rubell
