Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

As we prepare for the start of September, I find myself not just preparing for the High Holy days but also preparing for a family simcha, our child's B'nai Mitzvah. It is no small task, and the process has given me renewed respect and love for everyone who has undertaken this journey with their own family.

There are so many details to manage, and it's easy to get caught up in them. It's easy to lose sight of the deeper meaning behind it all. This is especially true for many of our 13-year-olds. For them, the experience can be relegated to practicing Hebrew that they might not understand, an unease in standing in front of people, or focus on the party.

As I reflect on all of this, I find myself thinking about how the modern B'nai Mitzvah experience is so far removed from its original form. In fact, the earliest Bar Mitzvah (and later, Bat Mitzvah) traditions would be barely recognizable to us today. The term "Bar Mitzvah" was initially just a legal designation for any 13-year-old Jewish boy. It wasn't tied to a ritual or celebration. It signified that a child had reached the age of religious responsibility, capable of observing mitzvot independently of their parents. There was no service, no party, and no fanfare.

According to the Mishnah, an ancient Jewish code of law, the prerequisite for becoming a Bar Mitzvah (a son of the commandments) rested with his father. This included circumcision, learning Torah, a trade, and how to swim. That was the foundation. In some ways, it was more comprehensive, but in others, less performative.

In regard to the ceremonies, one of the earliest known rituals for becoming a Bar Mitzvah included a simple aliyah. This dates back to the 4th century. It wasn't until the Middle Ages, around the 16th and 17th centuries, that it became customary for the family to host a small party. In Poland, a Bar Mitzvah might offer a brief drash or chant a bit of Torah if he had a good singing voice. Compare that to today, where many B'nai Mitzvah lead an entire service, chant Torah and Haftarah (sometimes), offer a personal speech, and participate in a full weekend of celebrations that can feel like a mini-wedding.

As time passed, so did our notion of who to include. The first Bat Mitzvah occurred in 1922, when Judith Kaplan, daughter of Rabbi Mordecai Kaplan (founder of Reconstructionist Judaism), became the first girl in America to mark the rite. Widespread adoption of becoming Bat Mitzvah comes about in the 1970s.

In today's day and age in addition to welcoming women and others who never had the opportunity to become a bat mitzvah the chance to do so, many progressive Jewish communities, also offer gender-expansive youth the experience as well. Some have created new titles like Bet Mitzvah (referring to the Hebrew letter bet, a Hebrew reference to each of the ceremonies that begin with that Hebrew letter) and B Mitzvah (a reference to same set of titles using an English letter). These ceremonies honor each individual for who they are as they affirm their connection and commitment to Judaism.

Looking back at where we came from and where traditions originate is always helpful as we continue to revisit the idea of becoming a B'nai Mitzvah. And it's equally beautiful to see how those experiences expand in meaning, inclusivity, and purpose.

For me, reflecting on this long and rich history, I see becoming a B'nai mitzvah as a moment to ask: What does this mean to you/me? Whether we ask our children, grandchildren, or even ourselves, it is important to do so. We might also consider what rituals, values, and teachings we want to carry forward into our Jewish lives. These are powerful questions to consider at any age, and they lie at the heart of what it means to become a Jewish adult.

I hope to keep these questions present with both of my boys and for any person who becomes a B'nai Mitzvah at B'nai Israel Reform Temple.

And I hope that you will join me in celebrating that query.

In honor of Isaac's B'nai Mitzvah, we would love to celebrate with you, our congregational family, at Friday night services on **September 5th**. Join us for a special **oneg** in honor of this milestone. And as a bonus, it's also our very first **Early Bird Kabbalat Shabbat**, beginning at 6:00 PM. We'd love to see you there!





High Holy Day Security

Planning for the High Holy Days at B'nai Israel has been underway for some time. Included among the many considerations that contribute to a successful Holy Day season is the security of our Temple, its members and guests, during this high-visibility time of the year. Security plans have been reviewed and updated to include "lessons learned" from the past. Protocols have been shared with and endorsed by professionals specializing in the safety and security of Jewish facilities

Temple security volunteers will be on-hand at all services to monitor access to our buildings and property to ensure that everyone is known to us or properly vetted prior to entry. In addition to oversight by the Suffolk County Police Department and Auxiliary Police, as in past years, professional security has been engaged by B'nai Israel to maintain vigil and assist with screening of members and guests.

To assist in this effort, we ask for everyone's cooperation. To simplify and expedite entry, please remember to have your High Holy Day ticket with you for all services and any time you leave and re-enter the building. Tickets for non-member relatives and guests can be purchased in advance from the Temple Office.

In the unlikely event of an emergency, please follow instructions provided by security volunteers. Members who may require some additional time to exit the building are urged to find seating as close to an exit as possible and have someone available to offer any assistance that may be required. For everyone's safety, canes, walkers and wheelchairs need to be placed where they do not obstruct aisles or exits.








Dynamic Chair Yoga with Bonnie Rubell




