Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

It's December! And so, it is natural that we look forward to our next holiday, Hanukkah. It's a time of family, songs, miracles, victories, and for some, presents.

Historically, Hanukkah retells the story of Jews caught in a political and cultural struggle. There were the Hellenists, Jews and Greeks who embraced Greek culture, and the Maccabees, who sought to preserve a pure Judaism untainted by outside influences. The Maccabees resisted the spread of Hellenism and clashed with those who supported it. To complicate matters, Antiochus IV, the Seleucid king of Hellenistic Syria, imposed harsh restrictions on Jewish practice, desecrated the Temple, and forbade Jewish rituals. In response, the Maccabees revolted and, against all odds, triumphed. You might notice that nowhere in the original tale was there mention of a vial of oil. That came later when rabbinic texts added the story of the miraculous vial of oil that lasted eight nights.



The internal divisions among Jews are often left out of the Hanukkah story. We tend to focus on the military victory, and later, on the miracle of the oil. But this year, it is the infighting that resonates with me. Because this year, I have watched Jews across the world hold almost too tightly to their views about Israel concerning the war, morality, and leadership. One very recent example involved statements issued from different groups of Rabbis and Jews regarding their support or opposition to the recent Mayor-elect of NYC because of comments that he made about Israel. Every topic even remotely related to Israel has become binary; you agree with us, or you are against us. There is no room for nuance, no room for discussion.

Historically, we have been known for our diversity of thought. I've often joked about "2 Jews....three or more opinions." It saddens me that these differences have become wedges between us. I deeply understand the importance of Israel in our tradition, its central place in our rituals, calendar, and symbols. I also love that Israel serves as both a homeland and a powerful symbol for the Jewish people. Yet, I also understand those who question or criticize its actions. Israel is led by human beings, who, like all of us, are imperfect. Its critics, too, are imperfect. The topic is emotional, I empathize, but it is also dividing us on a national scale and within each denomination beyond reconciliation.

It has become so polarizing that we are scared to discuss it for fear of retaliation, whether physical or emotional. I hope that we might be able to find our way to advocating for what we believe in while refraining from condemning others for their views. Perhaps that's too much to ask for such an emotionally charged topic. But if we could learn to disagree with compassion, I believe we would emerge stronger as a community and as a people. If we can't, we risk repeating the same inner conflict that plagued our ancestors. Already, I've heard stories of synagogues where debates over Israel have escalated to acts of hostility against one another.

I believe the path forward begins with curiosity, with a genuine interest in why someone feels the way they do. You might even be surprised by what you hear. At the end of the day, our people are united by care, passion, and a shared sense of justice. Even when we see things differently, these values are part of our Jewish DNA.

Perhaps that's why, this year, I am especially looking forward to a beautiful moment of unity. On December 19th, our usual shabbat service will be transformed into Hanukkah Pajamica Shabbatica Dinner. Everyone is invited to bring their hanukkiah, and we'll all light them together in the social hall, each from our own seats, with the lights dimmed. There's something magical about bringing a bit of our home traditions into our shared sacred space. When the hanukkiot glow all around the room, it's as if a sky of stars is shining indoors, each family's light adding to the collective brilliance. Moments like these remind us that even in the darkest of times, our shared heritage, our light and our hope unite us.

For me, this is Hanukkah at its best. More than a public lighting or ceremony, this is the true heart of our community. I love the joy that each family brings and the reflection of love and wonder in every face lit by candlelight.

There will be many opportunities to gather and celebrate Hanukkah together this year. I hope you'll join in those that speak to you and remember, as you do, that there is far more that binds us together than separates us. Happy Hanukkah to all!

As a reminder...

B'nai Israel members should be aware that in the event of a medical emergency at the Temple, Automatic Electronic Defibrillators, (AED's,) are available for use in both buildings. In the school building an AED is mounted on the lobby wall adjacent to the Cantor's office. A second AED is mounted between the Rabbi's office and the sanctuary in the Temple building. In addition, first aid kits are located across the lobby from the AED in the school and immediately adjacent to the AED outside the Rabbi's office.

The Temple has a service contract in place to ensure that both AED devices are maintained on a routine basis and kept in good working order in the event they are needed in an emergency.

Although the AED's provide step by step verbal instructions while in use, the majority of our B'nai Israel Security Volunteers were recently trained and are certified in the administration of CPR and AED use if needed.

(Another) "Emergency" Blood Drive... and FREE Islander Tickets!

In what has become almost an annual ritual, the Long Island Blood Center is back to us once again asking if we could schedule an end-of-year blood drive at B'nai Israel on New Years Eve Day, 12/31, from 9:30 am to 2:00 pm. The somewhat unusual day and time was termed "critical" by them, more so even than the days or week before, as they anticipate the increased demand for blood over the remaining days of the winter break when donations are typically scarce.

As we do each year, we agreed, and committed to do the best we could. As an incentive, the Blood Center will offer a voucher to every donor, good for two tickets to an upcoming Islanders hockey game! (See the accompanying flyer.)

Now we ask every eligible member of the Temple community to step up and make plans to help us meet that commitment. As our Congregation ages there are fewer of our long-time "regulars" able to participate, so please reach out to any former or first-time potential donors: relatives, neighbors, kids home from school, visitors from out-of-town. Temple membership is NOT required. Donors can be as young as 17 with written parental permission. Beginning at age 75 seniors need one-time written medical clearance. All donors must have a picture ID. Repeat donors can expedite check-in if they bring their donor card. Online appointments are helpful, but if not, walk-ins will be welcome as well.

One last opportunity for a mitzvah in 2025!



activities to occupy children during Mom's treatment and recovery.




