Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

This past fall, our Adult Education class shared and discussed Jewish folk tales. Ever since the class, the story of the giant barrel has stuck with me. It tells a tale of a village that commemorates the marriage of the rabbi's adult child with a celebration in the town square. In the center, they erected a giant barrel. The idea was that villagers would add some wine to the barrel so that when it came time for the party, there would be enough for everyone to share. The towns people filled the barrel over the next week and waited with excitement as the mayor uncorked the barrel to give the preliminary toast. To everyone's surprise, clear water trickled down out of the spigot. Everyone gasped. What had happened? It turned out that every townsperson had put in a bottle of water thinking that theirs would be the only one. Each villager had expected the others to do their part, figuring that they didn't need to.



The story is resonating with me as the leadership of the congregation has discussions of our Temple's future. And it strikes me that as we discuss what it means to be a member of our community, we each have the choice to pour wine or water into our barrel. We love everyone, members or not. And we will continue to do so with all of our heart, with all of our mind, with all of our ability. That will never change.

Yet, we also need the continued support of the community to continue to thrive. Some have asked what is the benefit of membership? Certainly, there are perks, but the real perks are the intangibles. Becoming a member is ensuring that there will be a thriving community with a full barrel that we can all enjoy together. Becoming a member is an investment in Reform Judaism and a friendship community that shares a love for Temple. Becoming a member is a pledge that we will continue to have a sanctuary of joy and celebration, a place of support and inspiration. Becoming a member is investing in a Temple we love so that it can continue to be here for generations to come.

As we hit the New Years mark, it is the perfect time to consider becoming a member, if you haven't done so already.





Dynamic Chair Yoga with Bonnie Rubell


