Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

When I was a child, I was always fascinated with trees; the way they grow, their long roots that reach deep into the soil, and the creative ways in which they branch off. I loved to draw them. It was relaxing and comforting to feel the ways of the curves and straight lines work together to form a unique natural image. The texture added depth and the fresh smells were soothing. And they always seemed to adapt; changing along with the seasons, growing around obstacles and finding ways to survive even in the most hostile conditions.

As we approach Tu Bishevat, the New Year of the trees, I am reminded of their comfort, strength, beauty and constant adaptable cycle.

In a time when we feel that so much of our world is out of our control, I look to the trees and see a solid reminder that nature endures, that the seasons still change, that the beauty that lives within each unique tree still shines internally and externally. Sometimes we don't even see the change we yearn for, but it is there and slowly it is making a difference.

Rashi, a medieval commentator, explores this idea even deeper explaining that Tu Bishevat falls when it does because, around the 15th of *shevat*, "the bulk of the rainy season is already passed; now the sap begins to rise in the trees. The fruits will begin to blossom at this point."

I love this connection. It's when the internal change, the change that we can't even see, begins that marks the New Year for the trees.

We are like a tree in this moment. In winter in January and February, during the Hebrew month of *shevat*, we feel the cold and harsh winter. Many hunker down, snuggle with cozy blanket and bundle up under a sweater. We rest a little; some even take some time off. This is when our minds have a chance to rest and refresh, to recharge and renew, to start off a new secular year with fresh perspective and energy. We gear up for the year ahead.

This year in particular, many of us are truly rooting in place. Thankfully, the vaccine is being distributed, and while we can't see it yet, we are starting to make some progress in moving forward and placing the virus behind us. While it will take time to distribute and propel us out of the days of darkness, the sap, the sacred life force, the new cycle of healing is rising. The earth, and all of us are taking the first early steps toward renewed life, just like the tree.

So this year during Tu bishevat in addition to a seder, or shabbat reading, lets dig a little deeper and find some inspiration among the trees. Take some time to explore outside and find a tree that inspires you, plant an indoor seed to nurture for warmer times, or sit inside and draw a picture of a tree you see outside of your window. For within the thick bark, is a force trickling its way throughout the tree waiting to get out and be present in the world.

Wishing you all a meaningful and joyous Tu Bishevat!

I cannot wait to roll up my sleeve and be vaccinated. It is time to be able to feel a sense of relief. I want to be able to return to my not so normal life. I want to see my kids and my friends. I want to feel safe again. I want to change. Do you?

I hope 2021 is a good year for all of you. I hope it is filled with wonderful memories. Happy New Year.


