# Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

As we enter the month of May we enter the season of graduations. These ceremonies are liminal, in between moments, juxtaposed between past accomplishments and the future possibilities that lie ahead. In Judaism, a graduation, a *b'nai mitzvah*, a confirmation is not only a celebration of accomplishment, but also an affirmation, a commitment to embrace Jewish practices, rituals, and ideals in the future.

With this in mind, it feels as if our congregational community is about to *graduate* from online to in-person. May will afford an opportunity for some outside gatherings. Overall, it will be a slow and thoughtful reopening with health and safety at the forefront. But with that in mind, it will also bring back extra joy, connection, celebration, and creative future possibilities.

Like all graduations, it has come from hard work, not only on the part of health care workers and scientists who have cared for our ill, and created vaccinations, but hard work from Temple volunteers and professionals.

Since graduations are a time of transition, let's take a moment to appreciate all that we have accomplished. Throughout that time together, our Temple has persevered, adapted, and experimented. When the lockdown was started, we suddenly and skillfully moved from an in-person experience to an online Temple in an extremely short period of time.

During online services we use new technology and programs to explore the meaning of our prayers through seasonal and visual interpretations.

We reinvented each holiday and life cycle event, adding visual tefillah, videos, and creative presentations. The Sisterhood found a way to make gift shop sales into social events.

As I have said multiple times during the process both in these messages and at congregational meetings the opening process is going to be a crawl before you walk and walk before you run process. The committee fully understands the want (and need) for us to get back into our sanctuary.

In May we will be holding an outdoor service like we did a few times last year. That service will be on May 28<sup>th</sup> with a limited attendance. That attendance will be in the 25-30 person range and will depend on how many from a particular family are coming. Singing at this service will be strongly discouraged because of the risk of transmission of Covid involved. Registration will be required for this service and a lottery will be used if we have more registrants than room. In May there will also be outdoor B'nai Mitzvah services and also Confirmation will be outdoors. As in the past the outdoor aspect of these services will be weather permitting. Please check our website and weekly email very soon for the registration link.

We are working on a way to have a zoom aspect for the Shabbat service on the 28<sup>th</sup> however it will not be a live zoom of that service. One point that we learned from last year is that the outdoor zoom didn't work for many reasons, one of which was the fact that the quality was below subpar.

June is where we will make some great strides in getting back into the building. We will have two outdoor services (6/4 and 6/11) and on June 25<sup>th</sup> we will be back in our building. Again with a reduced capacity of around 30 people. Again singing at the services will be strongly discouraged and there will be no Oneg after services.

This will put as at the walk part of getting back into the building. As we move forward the goal is going to be to increase capacity (and amount of services inside) as long as it is safe and effective.

A HUGE thank you to all of the committees and people involved, who have put in enormous amounts of time and effort these past several months, in preparing for our reopening. We are all very excited to see each other in person again.

# Reopening Committee Update (Continued)

The plan for the coming school year is to have school in person from the beginning! The board of education is working hard to make that happen.

We understand that everyone wants to be back in the building full time and some feel that we should already be there. This has been a long and arduous process and we are at the finish line. Thank you to all for your patience during the process and for letting the process work itself out.

Lastly, we did have engineers come out and review the HVAC systems in both buildings. Needless to say they need more than just a little TLC. The school building has the original units from the mid 1980's and are past their expect life. The main building has newer units from when the sanctuary was redone in the early 2000's but are at the end of their expect life. The main building, we were able to put MRV13 filters in to help with filtration, but we can't do that in the school building. For the school building we will look to get portable filtration units as stop gap action to help filter out particles such as Covid 19. Both sets of units will need to be replaced and the Building and Grounds committee will be working on that.

And together we have offered condolences and mourned those we have lost.

As we start to look to the future, we create new hopes, new plans and consider new possibilities through the hard work of the reopening committee. How might we balance the needs of those in our community that cannot come to in person events with the needs of those who can? How can we honor what has come before, and yet still look to the future?
