Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

A little over three years ago, my husband and I were deciding whether to make the move to New York. One of the deciding factors was a conversation I had with Steve Sonkin, of blessed memory, who (like he always did) cut right to the chase. He told me directly what the congregation wanted and asked if I was in. I was very moved by his candid honest and direct approach, one that I have come to know a little more in my time in New York. And now, three years later, I know that his words will forever stick with me and inspire me.

And so, as I sit here and prepare for this once again unique High Holy Day Season, I find I need to look at our celebration through a similar lens. How do we keep everything that is meaningful, powerful, inspiration, and familiar/comforting, yet at the same time make it more compact, allowing

us to get straight to the point?

In short, what is the most essential message of the 5782 High Holy Days and what is the core and most essential elements for our congregation?

There are of course many central elements one might consider: shofar sounding (awakening), praying (our relationship with God), giving tzedakah (fulfilling the mission to heal our world), etc. However, I have come to the conclusion that the heart of our upcoming High Holy Days is *teshuva*, which means, "returning."

The traditional context of this word/concept refers to returning to a righteous path. Yet, it takes on an additional meaning this year. This summer and this fall we are returning to the Synagogue Building, to in person events, and to communal gatherings. For those that are able to return and for those that are returning in heart and spirit, we ask the question, "how can we make the most of that return?"

I say, let's take the teshuva, "returning," to heart.

In the literal sense of the word, let's remember all that we have missed and are excited to return to: shofar blowing, familiar tunes, striking theological queries, and important High Holiday moments like changing the Torah covers and hearing the kol nidrei melody. On a spiritual level, let's take a moment to begin the true work of teshuva: to ask and pray for forgiveness, to regret our past wrongs, and to plan for a better tomorrow. But let's also take both of these ideas one step further. Let's consider who we are at our best, and how we get from where we are to where we want to be. On a communal level, let's consider what does our best, most understanding community look like in practice and spirit. Most importantly, we consider how we might use these High Holy Days as a springboard to answer these questions and make lasting positive change. All of these questions are a part of what a High Holy Day celebration is and should be at its core.

In terms of how we will bring this theme to life, this year's services will be about finding what is paramount and best about the High Holy Days and embracing it. We will provide a variety of worship formats that allow us to reach out to the most people including inside, outdoor and online prayer options (most services will include all three options). We will bolster our healing service and make it an essential part of our worship. We will explore creative ways to celebrate the beautiful readings that we used last year with our new High Holy Day prayerbooks, *Mishkan Hanefesh*, highlighting the theme of *teshuva*. And our services will be direct, cutting to the chase. Our hope is that all of these options will allow each of us to find a safe space to pray in a way that is comfortable and respectful to where we are philosophically and spiritually. And that our High Holy Day experience will inspire us to dig deep and ask the big questions that *teshuva* demands.

We are so excited to celebrate with together, returning not only the Synagogue building, but to our very best selves and our most essential Holiday celebrations.

May we all have a wonderful, healthy and happy New Year!

President's Message



Greetings all, and I hope you're having a very nice summer!

Temple clergy, staff, and volunteers are very busy preparing for another unusual High Holiday season. This one, however, will be much closer to normal than last year's entirely virtual services. We expect to offer everyone the opportunity to attend our services either in person or virtually through Zoom.

Provided that the vaccination rate continues to increase, and the infection rate continues to fall, we anticipate being able to open the Temple building to all member families wishing to attend in person. We are also renting a big tent for the back lawn to conduct family services, healing services, and for people who would prefer to sit outside. All attendees will be required to wear masks. In addition, a new location is being sought for the Tashlikh service.

Another change this year, will be the introduction of new High Holiday prayer books. There is one for Rosh Hashanah, and another for Yom Kippur. These books have a familiar layout to our Mishkan T'Filah books, and have new translations, study texts, extensive

transliterations, etc. We will be asking for donations to help defray the costs, and we are working on ways for people participating on Zoom to purchase or borrow the prayer books.

I trust that everyone in our Temple family will find the services being planned by the Rabbi, Cantor, and Ritual Committee to be meaningful and thought provoking, and that we will be able to participate as a community. Please look for additional information in the mail and check our website regularly for updates. Your help and patience as we adjust to the new normal is greatly appreciated.

On another topic, I'd like to give **A BIG SHOUT-OUT** to the **West Sayville Fire Department**, and to **Paul Haines** and his company, East Moriches Fuel. During a thunderstorm on July 6th, one of our sanctuary air conditioning units got severely damaged. The Fire Department had a rapid and significant response to the alarms, determined what was going on, shut off the unit, checked the building carefully, and vented most of the smoke. Fortunately, there was no fire. They were all polite and professional, and minimized the damage to the building. Then, within 24 hours, Paul Haines and his team got the extensive A/C damage repaired and made the system fully operational. We are all grateful to them for their immediate response and assistance.

Long Island Ducks Update VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

We Need You! Our Ducks fund raising season is about half over, and the best is yet to come. It's not too late to step up and help B'nai Israel earn a 10% commission on all sales working a variety of concession stands at the Ducks' Central Islip ballpark.

We are scheduled to work Saturday evenings August 14th and September 4th. For both games we will report at 4:30 PM for a 6:35 game time and wrap up at the end of the game. Our volunteers are welcome to stay around for the post-game fireworks show planned for both nights. This season we have been deployed at stands selling everything from ice cream to turkey legs, Dippy Dots to an assortment of premium beers, all in addition to the usual ballpark fare of burgers, dogs, tenders and fries.

The need is for cashiers and helpers, so money-handling is optional and whatever training may be necessary can be wrapped up prior to game time. We have a cadre of experienced volunteers, but need additional help to expand our reach, and therefore our income. As paid concession employees begin returning to school mid-August, the need and opportunity for Temple volunteers is expected to increase, but we can only take advantage if we provide the people. (In prior years we've been invited to work at additional games later in the season, so if Saturday evenings don't work for you there are likely to be other opportunities to pitch in.)

Donors must be healthy and pass a simple question and answer screening that has become common during the Covid crisis. Sixteen-year-olds require written permission from a parent. At 75, a doctor's clearance is required. All donors must present a photo ID.

To minimize crowding and wait times, appointments are strongly recommended by contacting the Temple Office or the Blood Center directly. (See flyer on next page) As always, walk-ins will be welcome so long as they can be accommodated.
