Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

Much have I learned from my teachers, more from my colleagues, but most from my students.

~ Talmud, Ta'anit 7b

This October, we will have some great opportunities to study and learn from each other. Whether you are new to Judaism and wish to learn more, like to study torah, or you heard about our Circles initiative from last spring and want to give it a try, there are many options available.

Torah study has always been a source of joy and excitement for me. This year, we are different than last year, we have a year's worth of experiences that may or may not change our perspective. As we change, our relationship to the text changes also evolves. I hope you will join me to share your unique ideas and thoughts. The first session will take place online. Location for the rest of the lessons will be determined by everyone who attends. This will give us the opportunity to share where we might be most excited and comfortable to study.

Our adult education class will be centered around studying and creating ethical wills. This will afford us the opportunity to explore the values and teachings that are most dear to who we are. Unlike a material will, conversations will not focus on what we have, but instead on what we wish to impart to our children and future generations so that they may remember us and learn from us. Each of us has a story worth sharing and remembering. Ethical wills is a practice that is rooted in rich Jewish tradition and history. Come learn, share and explore this important topic with me and other participants.

For those who are working toward conversion, we will meet one on one on various Monday evenings.

We will also be continuing our Circles program. While this isn't a traditional educational experience, it's a great opportunity to learn more about ourselves, our connection to Judaism, and our fellow congregants. More information will follow later in the fall about this exciting opportunity. If you are interested in helping to organize, please let me know.

I can't wait to learn from all of you this fall- to learn new perspectives on ancient teachings, and to connect more deeply through the process.

As the grandfather of a toddler, I have become familiar with the CoComelon children's program on Netflix. The lyrics seem to float around in my head (at least as much as the choir music). In my Kol Nidre appeal, I certainly did a bit of the "Please" part, asking Temple members and friends to give generously of their time in volunteering and to open their wallets to make financial contributions.

Now, it is my turn to say, "Thank You!" First, thank you to all the volunteers and staff listed in this bulletin who worked tirelessly to make the "Hybrid High Holidays" a success. No portion of this task was easy: The Rabbi was working with new prayerbooks and needed to divide

up the services into time friendly bundles; the Cantor needed to sing more solos in order to keep group singing to a moderate level (*while wearing a mask!*); and the work to arrange for a tent, stream all services, check vaccination information, package break fast snacks, etc., was daunting. While we certainly had many small hiccoughs, most aspects worked surprisingly well. Up to 100 people attended at a time in person (especially for the Family Services), and over 200 attended online through Zoom and Facebook Live.

Secondly, I would like to thank all of you who contributed already or will soon be contributing financially to the Temple. The High Holiday donations are a key aspect of our annual fundraising goals, and the support from so many families is both heartwarming and essential to our financial stability.

Even in these difficult times, B'nai Israel is finding ways to connect with our members, and we appreciate everyone's efforts and participation.



A Message from Sisterhood...

As I have mentioned, selecting a topic for a bulletin article has always been hard for me. But it's October and the High Holidays have passed. We are already into the early fall. This month is Breast Cancer Prevention Month; this is an important topic for me personally, as it should be for all of us.

Most of you know I have been fighting breast cancer since 2017, and each day seems like a new and different adventure. This journey has not been an easy one, but it shaped me into the person that I have become. It has taught me that I am stronger than I ever though I would be and that it's OK to accept help from others.

Another thing I learned is that we are fortunate to be living close to some terrific cancer centers. For me, I have found the doctors and researchers at Stony Brook hospital to be wonderful. They have developed new cutting edge treatments to conquer this aggressive disease.

Finding new techniques to combat cancer takes money. Fundraising makes a big difference in this fight. Millions and millions of dollars are currently invested in breast cancer research and grants. In addition, women, and sometimes men, who have this disease need extra support in their fight to health and recovery. There are a variety of needs: rides to treatment, a place to stay, babysitting, wellness and beauty services.

This month *Making Strides for Breast Cancer* will hold its usual Jones Beach walk. Our Sisterhood team is walking in Sayville to avoid the crowds. You still can contribute, walk with us and make a donations. The bulletin flyer is interactive: make a donation by just clicking the button. It is going to ask you for a team name. Ours is easy - *B'nai Israel Reform Temple Sisterhood*. Just click and donate. Please be as generous as you can.

There is something else that I am asking all of you to do. Be proactive, do monthly breast self-examinations and go for breast cancer screenings and a mammography. Encourage your friends and family to do the same.

As I have stated before, it takes a tribe and a good family and lots of good friends to survive breast cancer. I would like to thank my late husband, Bruce, my two children and their significant others for taking really good care of me. I would also like to thank my friends in Sisterhood for their love and support.


