Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

It is hard to believe that this month, we will sit and watch the colors change, make plans for Thanksgiving, and of course.... start our celebration of Hanukkah, the festival of lights. As they say, Jewish holidays are either early or late, but never on time, at least in the secular calendar. While not quite as early as the 'Thanksgivukkah' of a few years past, it is pretty close, starting just 3 days later.

And so, I have already started reflecting on the meaning of the holiday. This year my thoughts took me on a journey to my past. When I was a child, I had the honor to sing with other kids in a Hanukah sing along album for kids. It was a lot of fun, and a lot of work, and I still know more Hanukkah songs than for almost any other holiday.

One of the tunes I learned through the project had lyrics to a haunting, and melancholy tune. It was called, "My Candles." A little girl sang, "In the window where you can send your glow from my menorah on newly fallen snow, I will set you one little candle on this the first night of Hanukah." Years later, this little known Hannukah song has stuck with me. Mostly because it didn't have the same joyous character of so many other Hanukah songs ("Sivivon Sov Sov Sov," or "Oh Hanukah Oh Hanukah", etc.), or even that spirit of upfront resistance that drives "Light One Candle" or "Not by Might." It seemed to me as I listened, that this song was revealing another dimension of Hanukkah.

Traditionally, we place the chanukiah in the window to proclaim to the world the beauty of the miracle of the story, the oil that lasted 8 days and nights, a story added to the narrative years after the events. But, perhaps, we also do so for a personal reminder, of a glow that emanates from within us. We are the people who first see the glow, the light of the menorah and its reflection, which is initiated from our act of lighting the menorah in the first place. Whether through the glass in the window or from clear snow, we behold a powerful and beautiful image. The glow from the dancing flames that bounces back creates a story of its own, one of a resilient, vulnerable spirit shining forth, persisting. This is a miracle in and of its own right. And I see it in so many of us today: a strength in being true to our feelings, a strength in holding on to our core beliefs, a strength in the holiness coming together to celebrate Judaism, and the strength of empathy and understanding. It's the strength of our people who proclaim: we are still here, and we are proud and holy sometimes when we feel sadness and sometimes when we feel joy.

This song sparked in me a reminder of a different kind of resistance, one that sings a melody that stays with you throughout your life. Deep within there is a somber tune that validates the hard and somber times we have. And when we persist in the face of this we shine even brighter than ever before. Reflections often start out as soft mirror images, but the light in particular takes on a strength in the colors it displays and the radiant rays of light it projects.

Sure, there are times we flicker, but as a whole, we have it in us to shine radiantly, like the reflections we see.

My hope is that as we celebrate this year, we see that beauty – that reflection. May we let it fill us up with hope, with resilience and persistence – reminding us to be our very best selves and inspiring us to sing out our story and celebrate it completely. Let us embrace the sad and the joyous moments and keep on shining!

May it be so, and may we all have a wonderful Hanukkah celebration!

Long Island Ducks 2021 Fund Raiser - It's a Wrap

The Long Island Ducks 2021 regular season ended as it began with three-day holiday weekend home games marred by foul weather. Both the Memorial Day and Columbus Day weekends featured unusually cool, wet weather, disappointing to the fans and disappointing to our Temple volunteers who hoped to raise money for B'nai Israel by working the stadium concession stands. Attendance on both weekends varied from sparse to none at all, as were sales and commissions. But at the nine Saturday and Fourth of July home games in between, a team of volunteers labored to earn more than \$13,000 in commissions and tips - the final accounting not yet available.

After missing a year due to the pandemic, a crew of 32 Temple members, their families and friends pitched in. Many worked only a single game. Some worked several and a few worked most. Ages ranged from teenager to octogenarian, but regardless, every one made themselves available to help support B'nai Israel and came through for us in a big way. With new concession management "feeling its way," new, unfamiliar equipment to deal with, amid concerns for personal health and safety, iffy weather and sporadic attendance, our volunteers dealt with whatever came their way and did an extraordinary job under difficult circumstances. We could not have earned what we did without the diligent effort of each and every volunteer and we are grateful to all of them.

Our thanks to Ducks volunteers and all Temple volunteers without whom there would be no B'nai Israel Reform Temple.

Too soon to begin recruiting for next year? Never too soon, with spring training right around the corner. We are planning on a 2022 season and will be asking for your help to make the Ducks concession fund raiser a financial success once again.

Your contributions will go a long way in enabling us to help those less fortunate.

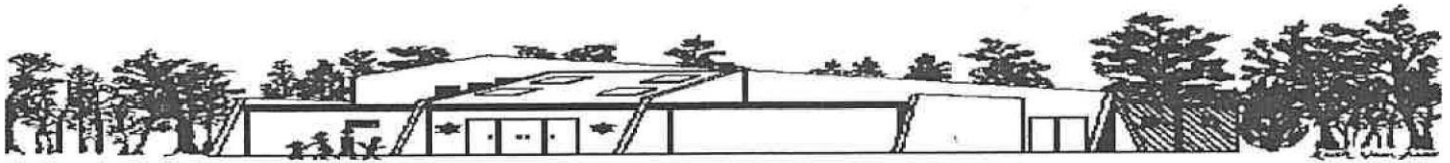

Re: COVID-19 Precautions for ALL B'nai Israel Services, Events, and Meetings

Dear B'nai Israel Families,

In order to best protect our members and guests, the Temple Board of Trustees is continuing to keep a close eye on the COVID-19 pandemic. The following new procedures have been adopted, and will be effective on November 1st:

1. **Proof of vaccinations (or documentation of negative test results within 72 hours) will be required for persons 12 years of age or over at all services, meetings, or events.**
2. **Masks will continue to be required and properly worn for persons over the age of 2.**
3. **All persons must sign-in at services and have their temperature taken.**
4. **The Board is committed to continue streaming services for the indefinite future, for anyone who prefers to participate in this way.**
5. **There will be no food served or onegs until further notice.**
6. **A letter will be forthcoming regarding procedures for the Religious School.**

We have the list of people who previously provided vaccination information to the Temple and are in the process of making a streamlined procedure to reduce congestion at the door.

Please help us to comply with these requirements by following the instructions of Temple clergy, staff, and volunteers.

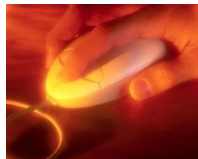
