Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

The Midrash state that in creation, shabbat came before God to say, "every day of the week has a companion, Sunday has Monday, Tuesday has Wednesday and so on. But I have no partner. God responds, 'The Jewish people will be your partner."

And so, we are.

One of my favorite times of the week is Shabbat. No matter how frustrating the week has been, how much prep time it takes to get there, there is something very uplifting about being together, singing, and offering blessings.

Each Friday, our family always sits down for a quick shabbat dinner, making sure to sing blessings over the candles, wine and challah. I love to watch my kids get into the simple melodies and sing along. And no matter how good or bad the week has been, we take a moment to offer personal blessings and we each share a moment of gratitude.

Shabbat joy continues once I get to Synagogue and I get to see all of you, whether online or in person. Each week, the Cantor weaves in kavanah and spirit through music and the prayerbook that roots us in traditional readings and allows for new interpretations each week.

It's remarkable; every shabbat I feel a lifted sense of community and of happiness, like a special shabbat glow.

And it continues to the next day when we get to celebrate a young person becoming a b'nai mitzvah, a child of the commandments, or participate in study – asking the questions that you never get to ask on a regular basis. What was God thinking when giving Joseph the power to interpret dreams? Does God think? Do we have the chutzpa to even ask such a question?

If you ever have wondered, why it is I wanted to be a Rabbi, there you have it. I love every second of it. I love the joy, the community, the songs, and the flexibility and beauty of the rituals.

And so, I encourage you to find a little extra joy in shabbat, the holiday that often gets less attention because it comes every week, but which deserves our commitment and love – simply because it does come every week.

One of the best ways to make it special is to add some separation between the rest of the week and Shabbat. It can be something simple, easy, and concrete.

Some folks find joy in a simple meal with friends, a special dessert, turning off your phone during shabbat, a walk in the park, or a conversation about the Torah portion of the week. There are countless ways to make shabbat our partner, and to commit to making it special each week. I hope to continue to hear more about how you make shabbat special and meaningful each week, and I pray that you too may find your own shabbat glow this month and beyond.

Eternal Vigilance

Dear Temple Families,

The quote "Eternal vigilance is the price we pay for liberty" is often attributed to President Jefferson.

While I think it was used mostly in the context of military preparedness and the protection of our then fledgling democracy, it also needs to be applied to the operation of our beloved B'nai Israel Reform Temple. We need to be good stewards of our buildings and finances lest the buildings deteriorate, or our funds dissipate. In addition, we need to be vigilant about stopping the spread of COVID-19 in our sanctuary and school, so that people can be free to learn and worship without fear of sickness. Lastly, we need to protect the people who attend our services from fear and intimidation both in person and online.

Many of you have heard that there was a vicious and unsettling "Zoom Bombing" of our Interfaith Thanksgiving Religious Service on November 7th. Hate speech and inappropriate

images were made by individuals in an attempt to create fear and disrupt the service. Fortunately, Jeannette Berman was able to contain the damage and evict the individuals within minutes, and Rabbi Rosenthal addressed the issue by reminding all participants that this is one of the most important reasons why the faiths must work together in combatting hatred.

Eternal vigilance means that we must now be more careful about how we publicize our online services, classes, and events. New protocols are being tested to increase security while still being as welcoming and inclusive as possible. Please make sure that you are on the Temple's email list, by signing up on the website, and please check your weekly emails for details regarding how to sign into the services. Better yet, if you are fully vaccinated, please join us in person. While many people cannot risk attending services in person, most should feel comfortable with the check-ins and masking.

Change "Pajama Shabbat" back to "In Person Shabbat," and let's worship together whenever possible!

I hope that you're having a very pleasant Hanukkah, and that many of you will be able to enjoy some time off at the end of the month.

Please continue to bring in tzedakah, \$ A Week and food for outreach!


After a year's hiatus due to the Covid-19 pandemic, B'nai Israel has partnered with the Long Island Blood Center to sponsor our "annual" end-of-the-year blood drive on **Sunday, December 19th, 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM**. A bagel and coffee breakfast will be provided by the Blood Center and every donor and would-be donor is invited and encouraged to pitch in that day.

As we say each year at this time, the seemingly perpetual blood shortage on Long Island and in the NY Metro area only gets worse as the various holidays, from Thanksgiving through New Years Day, occupy our time and attention. The pandemic has added to an already bad situation and the health and well-being of our neighbors are at risk should the available blood supply be depleted. Temple membership is not a prerequisite and extended family and friends are invited to participate.

Donors as young as 16 years old, (with written parental permission,) are eligible to donate. Seniors require a written medical clearance beginning at age 75. All potential donors must have a photo ID and previous donors can expedite the sign-in process if they bring their donor card. The Blood Center diligently adheres to all CDC and local Covid precautions to ensure everyone's health and safety, and B'nai Israel pandemic restrictions will apply as well.

Appointments are encouraged to facilitate staff scheduling, prevent over-crowding and enable everyone to adhere to social distancing protocol. 



Re: COVID-19 Precautions for ALL B'nai Israel Services, Events, and Meetings

Dear B'nai Israel Families,

In order to best protect our members and guests, the Temple Board of Trustees is continuing to keep a close eye on the COVID-19 pandemic. The following new procedures have been adopted, and will be effective on November $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$:

- 1. Proof of vaccinations (or documentation of negative test results within 72 hours) will be required for persons 12 years of age or over at all services, meetings, or events.
- 2. Masks will continue to be required and properly worn for persons over the age of 2.
- 3. All persons must sign-in at services and have their temperature taken.
- 4. The Board is committed to continue streaming services for the indefinite future, for anyone who prefers to participate in this way.
- 5. There will be no food served or onegs until further notice.
- 6. A letter will be forthcoming regarding procedures for the Religious School.

We have the list of people who previously provided vaccination information to the Temple and are in the process of making a streamlined procedure to reduce congestion at the door.

Please help us to comply with these requirements by following the instructions of Temple clergy, staff, and volunteers.


