Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

May is a time of emergence. Flowers begin to bloom, gardens begin to sprout, and birds' songs are everywhere. We come out of the winter caves we have dug ourselves into and might even be tempted to frolic. The joy that Spring brings also carries with it hope and renewal, and energy for new projects.

One of the most exciting parts of my job is to participate in continuing education. In Judaism, we speak of lifelong learners - because we know that the more we know, the more we realize we don't know. And because Judaism is constantly changing and evolving. Not only is it important to model continued learning - it is essential that I continue to gain new knowledge to share in the congregation.

In that spirit, this month I will participate in a series for clergy facilitated by the Religious Action Center or RAC, the social justice arm of the Reform movement. It is called: Using Our Moral Voices to Address Oppression Inside & Outside of Our Jewish Communities

This will be an opportunity to help clergy to deepen our commitment to and capacity for using our power as anti-racists, not just people who oppose racism, but who actively work to create a more just reality.

In addition, I will be taking a course on Pirke Avot. It will speak to how we navigate the tensions between truth and peace throughout these famous texts as well as within our world today.

For me, these opportunities are not only a way to bring Judaism to life but add an element of action. Much like the flowers pushing through the dirt to the surface that have deep roots, these activities will connect me to my past and force me to push upward and outward.

I look forward to sharing what I learn and continuing to learn from the wisdom that each of you provides. Together may we plant a gan eden, a garden of eden, bright, colorful diverse and beautiful.

It's Been Busy at the Temple!

Dear Temple Families,

April has been a busy time at the temple. There were two Religious School Seders, a Temple Seder, two B'nai Mitzvahs, a blood drive, Torah studies, and lots of meetings.

It is great to see all of this in person activity, and to know that we are also continuing to stream all of our services for those who are out of state or cannot attend in person.

There will be three more B'nai Mitzvahs in the month of May, and I encourage you to attend at least one of these Saturday morning services. It energizes me and gives me joy to see our young students lead the services and become Jewish adults surrounded by their friends and families.

I also encourage you to join our Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting on May 19th at 7 pm.

Last month, I wrote about the tremendous need for members to volunteer for Temple committees and events, and this month, I'd like to highlight a few of them:

1. If you've been to the Temple recently, you may have noticed workers power washing and sealing the concrete block façade of our building, and others cleaning out our sump. There is always necessary upkeep on our aging School and Temple building, and the Buildings and Grounds Committee needs to determine the necessary work and arrange for contractors and volunteers.
2. Likewise, the Ritual Committee is always busy. Not only does it prepare for the High Holidays, but it also works on the Passover Seder (and other events) along with Sisterhood, and has a role at every holiday and service throughout the year.
3. Lastly, the Membership Committee is also in need of new volunteers. Many of our long-standing Temple members have moved off of Long Island or are no longer able to attend services. We need new ideas and new events to encourage young and returning families to become involved.

If you have an hour or two per month, your assistance would be greatly appreciated. Please let Karen know at the office or reach out to me with any questions. We'll put you in touch with the correct people.

Finally, the B'nai Israel community continues to keep Ukraine and its besieged countrymen close in our thoughts and prayers during these tragic days. Our request for donations to HIAS in support of Ukrainian refugees has led to a contribution of about \$4,000 so far, including a special outreach donation from the Temple and another from the Sisterhood. Thank you to all who made this possible. Please keep the donations coming.

Ducks Fundraising Underway!

As you read this month's bulletin 2022 LI Ducks baseball is underway and our first game of the season working concession stands at Ducks Stadium in Central Islip is behind us. A full season of fund-raising opportunities lies ahead with eleven more Saturday night fire-works nights, ten Wednesday evenings and whatever other chances we get from time to time to earn big bucks for B'nai Israel. There will be monthly updates and reminders in the Bulletin and weekly updates to share the results of our efforts in a timely manner.

Our schedule for this month includes Saturdays, May 7th, 14th and 28th as well as Wednesdays, May 18th and 25th.

Whether you've worked with us in the past or are willing to give it a try for the first time, email ducks@bnai-israel.org to let us know that you are available to help.

We report to Ducks Stadium at 4:30 PM, game-time is typically 6:35 and we wrap-up at or toward the end of the game, usually after 9:00 PM. Volunteers must be at least 16 years old and able to work on their feet for the duration of the game. Uniform tee shirts and hats will be provided.

The 10% commission we receive on concession sales is important to B'nai Israel for several reasons. It is not only our largest single fund-raising effort of the year, but is all profit - we have no expense. And, it is unique in that it is all "outside" money - none comes out of the pockets of Temple members. As we wrap up our fiscal year in June and agonize over of the budget for next year, Ducks income is more important than ever in helping the Temple make ends meet. We need your help. This will streamline entry to their service.



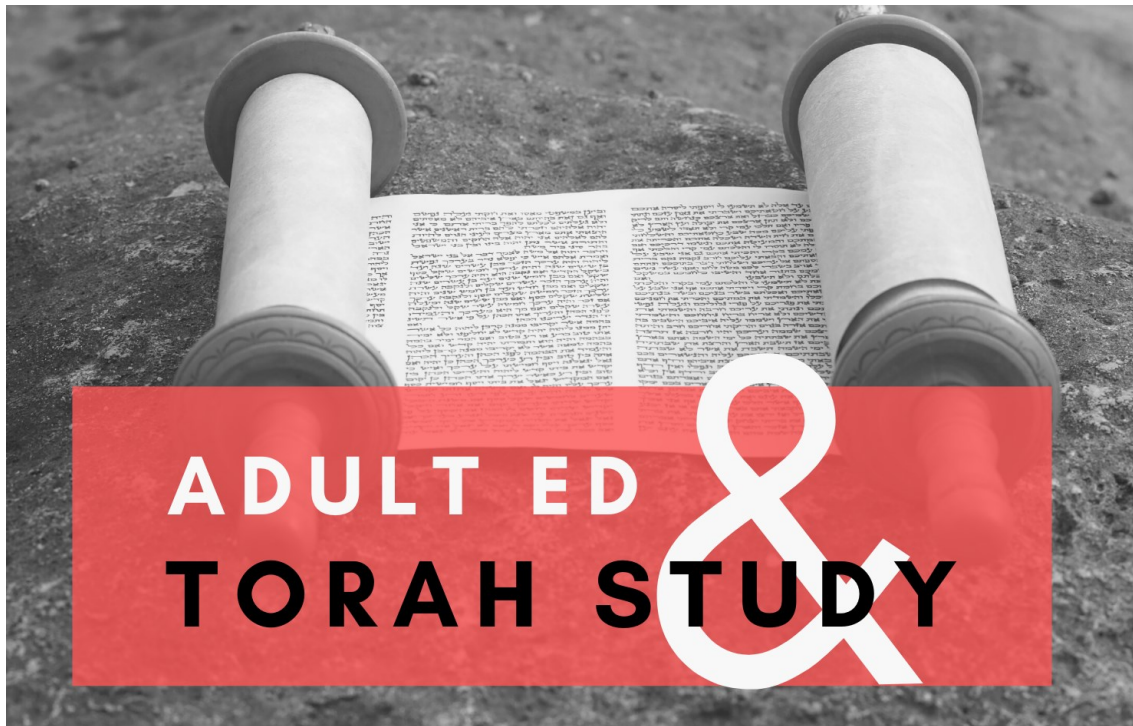

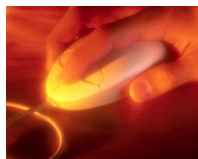
