#### Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

"Moses is saying two things about leadership. A leader must lead from the front: he or she must "go out before them." But a leader must not be so far out in front that, when he turns around, he finds no one following. He must "lead them out," meaning, he must carry people with him." ~Jonathan Sacks

These words are at the heart of Paul Fink's leadership style. As his tenure comes to an end, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Paul for his hard work and dedication.

The role of President of a congregation is never easy. It's a volunteer job where one constantly balances the needs of every person connected with the Temple, not to mention the needs of the building itself. And all of that is on a regular year. And the past year, has hardly been regular.

Paul stepped into the enormous role of helping us navigate in person experiences as the Pandemic was coming into one of its lulls. Throughout it all, he was pulled in countless directions. He found volunteers to check-in people for safety and health (which often included himself), he supported our leaders, he helped to rewrite and reorganize our systems and procedures, he constantly came into the Temple to see to logistical needs, and he sought to support so many who went through difficult times.

Paul always approached challenges with kindness, thoughtful logic, and a sense of equity. While it is not possible to please everyone, Paul certainly tried his best to do so.

Most people would say, "*dayeinu*," that would have been enough, but not Paul. On top of these many roles, Paul found time to lead one of our Circles groups quite effectively and with the skill of a true teacher and guide. He continued to participate in the choir, and he became one of our streaming volunteers in setting up a phone each week to use as our zoom camera in the Sanctuary.

He led the weekly announcements with presence and even managed to throw in several references to the weekly theme, sermon or random moment on the fly.

And he attended everything. If there was a *b'nai mitzvah* without a volunteer, Paul filled in. If there was a meeting he needed to attend, or a person who needed his time, Paul made time to be present.

Through it all, Paul kept a calm and soothing presence. If there was a tricky subject to discuss at a Board meeting, Paul made sure to let people have a voice, and yet direct the conversation to its natural conclusion.

And so, I hope you will join me in saying todah raba- thank you so much to our outgoing president for his dedication, countless hours of work, leadership, and for being a genuine exemplar.

Personally, I will miss our weekly conversations, and the discussions we had about the greater world. I'm so glad that goodbye to his role as President does not mean goodbye to his active role at our congregation. I look forward to continuing to work with Paul in the areas that he cares most deeply about including but not limited to community building, social justice, and music. Most of all I wish him and his family time for renewal and rest.

And with every outgoing president, there must also be an incoming President.

I'd like to extend a joyous mazal tov to our incoming President, Seth Berman, who made the swift decision to step up into this role. Seth is no stranger to the role and the congregation. He has a great love for the Reform movement and its institutions, and for our community. I look forward to partnering with him in the great work of lifting up our congregational values, hopes and vision: one of inclusion, welcome and family.

Additional gratitude to all of our lay leaders who are stepping down, and a heartfelt mazal tov to all who are stepping up to take on new leadership roles. Temple wouldn't be able to properly function without each of you.

I hope that you will join us on Friday night, June 3<sup>rd</sup> as we install our lay leaders for their upcoming terms. During the Service we will also celebrate Pride Shabbat and honor our LGBTQ+ friends with special readings.

May all of us work together: congregants, lay leaders and clergy, to create a loving and caring community, dedicated to the sacred work of making the world around us more tolerant, benevolent and just.

I would like to close by thanking the Executive Board, the Trustees, the Rabbi and Cantor, Karen Smollins, our numerous committees, Brotherhood and Sisterhood, the Religious School faculty, and all of the other volunteers for the tremendous work they have done over the past year to keep our School and Temple running safely and effectively <u>in-person and online</u> in these trying times. Without you, B'nai Israel would not be the wonderful and welcoming community that it is.

#### **Ducks Fund Raiser Update**

Our Long Island Ducks season got off to a cold, wet, but profitable start on opening weekend, April 23. Our earliest opening in three years was not great weather for baseball, with a smaller than normal Saturday night crowd, but fireworks kept fans in the ballpark and a dozen Temple volunteers earned \$1,501 in commissions for B'nai Israel.

Two weeks later a rainy weekend cancelled the game and as we go to press the weather forecast for our third game in mid-May is iffy, at best. But the season extends into September. We're scheduled to work every Saturday and Wednesday game. And sometimes we're asked for volunteers to help out, (and earn commissions,) at other big games throughout the regular season and playoffs. Earning a 10% commission on all we sell at stadium food and beverage stands, this fund raiser is by far the largest source of "outside" income for the Temple and more profitable than all other fund- raising activities combined.

Income is limited only by how many volunteers we can provide to work the stands. We are fortunate to have five first -time volunteers sign-up for 2022 and three were there on opening night, pulling their weight along with our experienced pros. More volunteers are always needed and welcomed. Minimum age is 16 and Community Service credit is offered to high school students upon request. Games in June are scheduled for the 4th, 8th, 18th, 22nd and 25th. Check the Temple calendar for June and July dates.

No one is asked or expected to work all our games. Some work only a few. Others work most. But we can use and appreciate whatever help we get. For further information and to volunteer, email <u>ducks@bnai-israel.org</u>.


