Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

On June 3rd, 1972, Sally Priesand became the first American woman rabbi. She was ordained at Plum Street Temple, in Cincinnati Ohio, by Alfred Gottschalk. This past June was the 50 year anniversary of her ordination.

She opened the door, and I entered.

I will always be forever grateful to her for doing so, because it was not easy.

And not only am I grateful to Sally because of her opening the door, but also the way she did it.

Sally wanted to go to rabbinical school, not to be a pioneer, but simply because it was what she was called to do. This authentic, humble and loving attitude, in my mind is central to what being a rabbi is. You can see a little of this in her story.

At 16, she wrote to Hebrew Union College and said, "I love everything about being Jewish- holidays, ritual, prayers, traditions. I am the only Jew in my school, and I am always asked to explain what it means to be Jewish. I want to study and become a rabbi. Please let me know when I can visit and learn more."

Her return letter read, "Dear Miss Priesand, thank you for your interest in our college. We have never ordained any women as rabbis. Most women prefer to become teachers."

Over 50 years later, these words infuriate me. Not only does the college tell Sally that they do not ordain women, but they imply that she shouldn't even desire this opportunity.

Luckily, she was not deterred. She enrolled and began her studies.

However, the naysayers continued, telling her she was only there to marry a rabbi, that she would never finish, or that no congregation would ever hire her.

Thankfully, she did not waver from the calling of her heart. Instead, she came up with a method to cope. She decided she would worry for only 10 minutes each day as much as she wanted, and then get up, get on and move forward. And while she was the last in her class to be hired, as she remarks, she was blessed with the best job of the year, at Stephen Wise Free Temple in New York City as an assistant rabbi.

50 years later, her legacy is clear. I am so thankful that Rabbi Priesand made it possible for me to choose this path.

Sadly, women rabbis still encounter sexism; there is more work to do. But as I look to women colleagues who now fill all types of Jewish clergy roles, in multiple denominations of Judaism I am inspired by what their voices, their perspectives, and their passion has added to Judaism.

My hope is to continue to use my voice in a way that helps to open doors for others, so that they too can one day look back and be grateful to those who came before them.

As we celebrate Jewish life, throughout July, I hope to draw strength from all that we do to continue that holy and sacred work. I hope you will join me in persisting and insisting for equality.





To protect the health of seniors, AARP suspended all in-person Driver Safety classes at the very beginning of the pandemic. As a result, the three-year cycle of classes hosted by B'nai Israel was cancelled and has not yet resumed. In-person classes were reinstated by AARP in July. If there is a show of interest within the Temple community, we can schedule a six-hour

class over two evening sessions in the fall, immediately after the High Holy Days.

Although the AARP class is geared toward senior drivers, any licensed NY State driver is eligible for insurance savings upon completion of the course. The cost would be \$25 for AARP members and \$30 for others. Please contact the Temple Office to let us know that you might be interested in attending.



Mid-Season Update

By the end of June, we will have already worked half the '22 baseball season and since the last update, most recently in the June bulletin, our "fortunes" have turned in a very profitable way. From a cool, rainy start, to some warmer and dryer weather, as the school-year winds down, attendance and income have increased accordingly. A "perfect storm" on the first Saturday night in June netted a record-setting combination of commissions and tips of almost \$3,000. "Hats off" and thank you to a dedicated team of ten B'nai Israel volunteers who labored non-stop that evening from the time the gates opened until at some point the food we sell actually ran out!

We are working home games Wednesday and Saturday evenings and now have been invited to provide additional help on Sundays as well. We are fortunate this year in adding a number of first-timers to our pool of volunteers, but we can use all the help we can get. The opportunities to earn this season are virtually limitless if we have the people to do the job! We work on our feet four to five hours per game. The minimum age is 16 and Community Service credit is offered to high school students upon request. Games in July are Saturday and Sunday the 2nd and 3rd and Saturday the 27th, all with fireworks at the end of the games, and Wednesdays the 6th, 13th and 17th.

It will mark the return to a traditional event that last took place prior to Covid and will be the first of what we hope to be many more in the months to come.

And special in a second way. The Temple Security Committee has arranged for a guest speaker on a topic that should be a concern to all of us. Robert Graves is a security professional, retired from the FBI and now working as an expert in "active threat response" for the Security Community Network, an organization sponsored by the Jewish Federation of North America.

Understand that his presentation is not just about Temple security. In fact, fewer than 5% of all active shooter incidents occur in houses of worship. So if you rarely, or never, attend services at B'nai Israel, but you shop, visit malls, attend sporting events, go to school or work and walk the streets, this presentation could be a life saver. Rabbis in both Pittsburgh and Colleyville, Texas who encountered active threats in their synagogues publicly credited their survival to security training they had received in the past. Our speaker will offer that training to B'nai Israel on the 24th. You should be there!

All adults and children no younger than middle school accompanied by a parent, are invited to join us. Due to the nature of the presentation, reservations are required. See bnai-israel.org, the weekly email, or the Temple office to RSVP. Your Board of Trustees, the Security Committee and Brotherhood urge you to attend to protect the safety and well-being of us all.


