## *Rabbi Rosenthal's Message*

Building a sukkah is one of my favorite activities to do with the family. Each step of the building process involves all of us, working together. The wood and other supplies need to be brought to the back yard. Posts need to be held while others drill them together. And then roof and walls need to be added and tied down. Once all of that is done, we work together to place the decorations, and lights inside and around the sukkah to make it bright and welcoming.

I love that this simple, temporary hut gets us outside, and that it connects us to each other and to the land.

I'll admit that our Sukkah is probably a far cry from the ancient huts described in our tradition. Although it is unclear exactly what the very first sukkot looked like and what they were used for. Some believe the huts were built so that farmers could live in them during the last months of the harvest. Others believe that the huts were linked to the pilgrimage to the Temple. The holiday itself is often called *chag ha-asif*, the Harvest Festival of ingathering.

Either way, Sukkot's history links us to the land, as the pilgrimage to the Temple was associated with offering up the bounty of our harvest, and harvest huts allowed us closer access to our bounty. And the holiday's current imagery and liturgy harken back to simpler times of gratitude for the harvest and prayers for rain at its conclusion.

In addition to connecting to our ancient ancestors a sukkah also links us to the marvel and wonder of the outdoors. We can peak through the roof, that is covered with natural material or scach and see the bright stars in between. We eat listening to sounds of the environment around us and take in the natural smells of the pine trees and leaves falling from the trees.

This year, I'm excited that our greater congregational family will get to join in with some of these beautiful sukkah themes. In partnership with the ritual committee, we recently purchased a sukkah to use outdoors, allowing all of us to engage in these wonderful moments.

While it is true that this means that our celebration will not be weatherproof, that in and of itself is part of what sukkot is about as well. The sukkah is meant to be a little flimsy, a little exposed to the elements, because that too connects us to the outdoors. As Rabbi Alan Lew z"l writes,

"In the sukkah, a house that is open to the world, a house that freely acknowledges that it cannot be the basis of our security, we let go of this need. The illusion of protection falls away, and suddenly we are flush with our life, feeling our life, following our life, doing its dance, one step after another."

Sometimes a reminder that we are not completely protected allows us to recognize our vulnerability and to connect even more deeply to our lands and to one another.

I hope that you will join us for our Sukkot Celebration on Sunday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022. At 6:00 pm we will decorate our new outdoor sukkah, at 7:00 pm we will have a short service and afterwards we will share a potluck dessert.

Wishing everyone an early chag sameach from the entire Rosenthal family.

I don't like to thank people by name as I am sure to leave out someone I do have to thank Joel Silverman for leading his "small army" in running the program for us. While this season is over we hope that in the spring when the baseball season starts up again you will consider to work one or more games for us. 

### **The '22 Ducks season is a "wrap"**

Seventeen ball games and two rainouts later the 2022 Ducks baseball season effectively ended for B'nai Israel on September 10<sup>th</sup> with a Saturday night fireworks game that saw eleven Temple volunteers earn an additional \$2,300+ in concession commissions and tips. And that final big night brought total earnings for the summer to just over \$22,000, a new record for B'nai Israel and a new record by far among all non-profit volunteer groups working for the Ducks over the years.

The season was highlighted by ups and downs based sometimes on the weather, sometimes on crowd size, and occasionally on over-staffing or under-staffing of the concessions. A windy, cold afternoon game in early May netted a low of \$137 while several sell-out Saturday nights earned us more than \$2,000 in a single evening. But overall, it was a terrific fund-raising opportunity and we were able to take full advantage.

A sincere thank you to a team of thirty-five Temple members, a few friends and family, and even a former member, for devoting almost 150 volunteer-days to make this the most successful of any fund-raising effort since the demise of our bingo program some years ago.

An in-person thank you is scheduled for Shabbat services and Oneg on Friday evening November 4<sup>th</sup>. If you were one of this season's Ducks volunteers, please put the date on your calendar and plan to join us at 8:00 PM that evening. Everyone else is encouraged to attend as well to join in thanking those volunteers for their significant contribution to the Temple's bottom line!
