Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

Lately it feels like the day has barely started and the sun is already going down. The days are getting shorter and shorter. The Hebrew month of Kislev (often the end of November -December) is the darkest month of the year. And for some of us, that can make it feel a little more isolated, a little less joyous, and a little darker.

I have always felt that in my heart of hearts that this is why Hanukkah, the festival of lights feels so welcoming, we are craving connection and the warmth of light.

For me, celebrating Hanukkah at this time of year evokes that special draw of the campfire or the fireplace in the cold. There is a special radiance dancing in the flames of a fire set to keep people

warm and serve as a persuasive invitation for gathering.

The flames of the hanukkiah feel just as inviting. In today's day and age, our Hanukkah rituals draw people around several glowing candles with a crispy smell of latkes in the air to warm our senses. In America, we often exchange gifts, sing songs and share the story of the Maccabees and the miraculous jar of oil. All of these activities celebrate comfort, warmth and light during dark times.

At the center of this experience, like so many of our holidays, are friends and family, and the joy of being together. There is a warmth and a radiance in just spending time together.

This year, in addition to the warm and comforting focus of Hanukkah, I recall the rededication of the ancient temple, or gathering place after it was desecrated by the Greek Seleucids who sought to rid the world of Judaism.

Hanukkah wasn't only about the miracle of the oil lasting for eight nights, but a joyous moment of reentering the ancient Temple to celebrate our faith.

In recent years, we reentered our holy B'nai Israel sanctuary and building, and have been trying to once more build community, not after a rebellion, but a pandemic. And while many of the restrictions have been lifted in everyday life, we can still feel a reluctance to come out and celebrate together.

I hear that and feel it.

My hope is that this year, whether we gather in our homes, or at B'nai Israel Reform Temple for our Hanukkah Pajamukah Shabbat (December 23rd at 7:15), at our Children's Hanukkah party (December 17th at 12:15), for the community at menorah lightings (on December 18th) or assisted living visits (December 19th), that we do so with a little extra friendship and community. Invite someone from Temple you've always wanted to know a little better over to sing the blessings over the candles one night or take a friend you haven't seen in a while to a temple event. Because that love, that connection, is holy, miraculous, and full of light. Our links to one another are the flames that spark strength and hope.

I feel the need more than ever to extend that sense of family and friendship to more people, outside our most familiar circles and to venture out to be with our B'nai Israel family. Community and togetherness are what bind us together, and give us a shared purpose, in a world that doesn't always see us for who we are.

And remember, a candle's light is not diminished when it lights another candle. The light we spread when we are together nurtures our souls just as much as it enriches our family and friends' *neshmas* (spirits).

This year, may we spread our warmth with new friends and old, with family members and our congregational family. In doing so, we make sure that this month of Kislev is the brightest one we have ever known.



ANOTHER BLOOD CENTER EMERGENCY

Our "emergency" blood drives have become more the rule than the exception since the pandemic, and before that most years between the Thanksgiving holiday and into the New Year. This time an added problem has surfaced: personnel shortages among the Long Island Blood Center staff. Even the limited number of post-Covid drives are being cut back further and many smaller locations are being eliminated altogether. Although modest by comparison to some locations, B'nai Israel is an exception to that policy as we have a history of meeting our commitments and have been particularly helpful to the Blood Center at years' end.

We have been asked to host an abbreviated drive at the Temple on Tuesday, December 27th from 2:30 to 7:00 PM. As always, we encourage both regular and first-time donors to make plans to volunteer at that time. Donors are eligible starting at age 16 (with written parental permission) and older. Offer to schedule and bring along family members and friends. (Temple membership is not required to participate.) Repeat donors can expediate check-in with their Blood Center card and every donor must have a picture ID available.

Because of limited hours and carefully scheduled staff, appointments directly with the Blood Center are strongly encouraged by clicking or scanning the flyer, or by phone. Walk-ins are always welcome but notice in the fine print, only if space permits! We will do our best to accommodate everyone. A pair of "donor socks" will be offered to all who show up to donate, but the real incentive is to make blood available to treat emergencies and medical situations within our Long Island community. The need is especially dire during the holiday season so please do what you can help.




