Could it possibly be baseball season already? Not exactly, but as you read this edition of the bulletin, spring training will be ramping up in warmer climates. Locally, arrangements have already been made with the Long Island Ducks to work at their concession stands and earn commissions and tips as a fund-raiser for B'nai Israel. Plans have been firmed up and a signed contract is in place for the 2023 season. Baseball at the Ducks Stadium in Central Islip gets underway on **Tuesday evening, May 2nd**, and we hope to have our volunteers work that game and as many more as possible through the entire season.

For the first time we have been invited to work any and all weekend and weekday games, with the exception of Friday evenings. Historically, Saturday evening fireworks games have been the big draw and earn the big money, but we found last season that putting a few of us to work during the week as well, adds up over the season and allowed us to break all our previous records with over \$21,000 in outside income for B'nai Israel. (And our help is valued and appreciated by Ducks management as well.)

We actually hope to do even better this year, but to do that we need the participation of many additional Temple volunteers. There will a lot more information on volunteer opportunities closer to opening day, but meanwhile you can <u>check out the schedule on the Ducks web site</u> and/or contact us at <u>ducks@bnai-israel.org</u> to get on our email list for Ducks updates. We hope to see our experienced folks back along with many new faces for the 2023 season.


