Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

As far back as I can remember, we have always celebrated Purim as a kid's holiday. We dress in costume, we often have a shpeil that contains songs and kid friendly themes, we gather to hear the megillah which contains the story of Purim, we sing joyous songs, we eat triangular hamantaschen cookies, we make noise with our graggers, and we have a festive carnival. These events are amazing, and we will continue to celebrate them. But today, I'd like to spend some time talking about how Purim is actually an adult holiday.

Truly Purim is full of several mature moments and themes. Traditionally, we consume liquor until

we can't recognize blessed Mordechai from cursed Haman, we tell a story that is full of inuendo and violence (75,000 people die), and there is a deep universal theme for all ages and Jews everywhere: antisemitism is real and it's important to stand up against hatred.

At its core, though, Purim is a holiday of celebrating our victory over those who wish to harm us. The rejoicing is what we tend to focus on and that is legitimate. The world can be dark and celebrating our successes and our bravery is a wonderful thing to do. And that should never be limited to kids.

This is one of many reasons that we are expanding our Purim offerings this year. In addition to the fabulous festive carnival, we will also have our first ever Purim masquerade for adults on Saturday, March 4th. It will be an opportunity to socialize, eat together, dance and have fun! We will hear a few brief moments of the Purim story from Achashverosh's guests, but the real focus will be on rejoicing and spending quality time together.

Judaism provides the opportunity to try new things, to explore our religion, and to highlight the many varied themes embedded within each holiday. It's one of the aspects about Judaism that I love, and I love to see it being embraced by the community as well. So a special thank you to Sandy Weber who is behind so much of the creativity of this exciting event along with all who will be working behind the scenes to make it come to fruition.

I hope you will join us, participate in the raffle and dance the night away. We encourage you to have a little fun and dress up, wear a mask, or a costume if you'd like, but they are certainly not required. I plan to wear a fancy mask along with a nice dress.

In addition to this marvelous masquerade, we will be celebrating Purim during Friday night services, March 3rd at 7:15 with traditional Purim songs, a short megillah reading and a costume parade for kids and kids at heart. Saturday March 4th, right after religious school, Allison Rothstein and Alysha Abrams will be organizing a Purim carnival with traditional treats and games.

Purim is a wonderful holiday full of varied themes for all ages. We look forward to highlighting a few additional traditions this year and wish everyone a *Chag Purim Sameach*, a Happy Purim!

PLAY BALL with the Long Island Ducks

As major league baseball begins spring training this week, our Long Island Ducks are preparing for a full season of baseball beginning in early May. And once again B'nai Israel is gearing up for its biggest fund-raising opportunity of the year by working concessions stands and **earning a 10% commission on sales of food and beverages**. A big change for the upcoming season is the chance to work more games during the week in addition to our big money-makers on Saturday nights. Some food prices have been raised again this year which means more in commissions on every sale at every game.

To put it in perspective, during the 2022 season we earned just over \$22,000 in what we call "outside" money, meaning the income is from a source other than the Temple family. It cost us nothing out-of-pocket - only the investment in time our members spend **volunteering** at the Ducks stadium in Central Islip. This is not only our most profitable fund-raiser but earns more net income than all other fund-raisers combined. Our income is limited only by how many people we can sign-up to work a given game. Our help is always welcomed by concession management. As always, more **volunteers** are needed!

No one is expected to work every game or even most of the games. As we did last season, we strive to have no one work more than one game in a given week, and never any more than can be handled comfortably. If you've worked with us before we'll reach out and ask that you do so again this year. If you've never done it before, please offer to give it a try. (With more weeknight games available to us it may be helpful to first try a lightly attended mid-week game before jumping into a Saturday night sell-out situation!)

Volunteers must be at least 16 years old and everyone must be physically able to work on their feet for an extended period of time. Cash registers are tablet-based and easy to learn and operate. Training is on-the-job. With an early start and some practice before the game, everyone is ready to go by the time the gates open. Uniform hats and tee shirts are provided.

If all this looks familiar, it should. B'nai Israel and the Long Island Ducks have worked together for years. Our opportunity to benefit has never been greater, nor the need for outside income more important. But as always, without **volunteers** it can't happen. The Ducks season begins at home May 2nd, 3rd, 4th and Saturday night May 6th with the first big Saturday night fireworks game. (B'nai Israel does not participate in Friday night games.) Each month's schedule will appear in the Temple bulletin or see the full season on the LI Ducks web site. A pocket schedule is available in the Temple lobby.

Women's Seders began in the mid 1970's when Esther Broner hosted a dozen Jewish feminist activists including Gloria Steinem and Letty Cottin Pogrebin. Today, women's seders are held all over the world, raising questions, sharing experiences and re-interpreting familiar rituals and prayers. The first women's haggadah was published in Ms. Magazine in 1976. Since then, women's haggadot have continuously developed, often including the Wise Women, the Four Daughters, the Women's Questions, The Women's Plagues, and a (Sources: O. Harrison, Bust.com; Ritualwell.org; JWA.org) women-version Dayanu.

Using resources like Haggadot.com, I scoured the internet to create a new Haggadahfor our Sisterhood Women's Seder. Please join us on March 21, as we celebrate Jewish women - past and present- with song, ritual, story, and prayer. Come fill Miriam's Cup and enjoy a lighttaste of Seder!




