## Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

During the month of July, I find floating in the pool to be one of the most relaxing experiences possible. The gentle waves and the ability to see nature all around me fill me with peace and calm. We all need that, maybe not in a pool, but through an activity that helps us feel calm and connected and allows us to let the stress and the challenges of the world melt away.

Another activity I find to be healing is shabbat. At home, having a sit-down dinner with the family and saying the blessing together while sharing our individual moments of gratitude is wonderful. And services offer me a place to sing out, to set aside the chaos of the week and to concentrate on family and community. Shabbat makes me feel whole and joyful.

So, it's no surprise that one of my favorite Shabbat experiences at B'nai Israel is the perfect blending of the two, Shabbat at the beach. There is something so soothing about the sound of the waves and so special about the soft sand beneath our feet. There is nothing better than taking in the healing sounds of nature mixed with our prayer and song. I hope you will join us for our Shabbat at the Beach this month on Friday, July 21, 2023. Folks are invited to bring dinner and schmooze starting at 6:00 by the new playground, and to join in our service at 6:30 pm.

Nature in general is a wonderful opportunity to connect with Jewish roots. July is a month of beauty, especially on Long Island. It is the perfect time to visit farms, and to pick a fruit or vegetable. It is one of the best times to hike, garden or simply sit outside in the shade and sip a cool drink.

These activities aren't just relaxing, but also connect us to our Jewish roots. In Genesis 2:15, we are called to be guardians of the earth, Shomrei Adamah. It is up to us to preserve our earth, and to connect to it deeply. The best way to begin on this journey is to enjoy the beauty and bounty that nature has to offer.

Our rituals even have roots in the natural world as they are largely developed from the farming and agricultural cycles of our ancient ancestors.

In addition, Judaism teaches us to find gratitude. Traditionally, we are tasked with reciting 100 blessings each day., When we are outside, it's easy to look everywhere and find moments of awe.

For some, it is important to look inward, to find healing and peace. Mindful breathing and a simple recitation of the shema, holding on to each syllable as it is spoken or sung can be immensely gratifying and remind us of the importance of focusing on adding holiness into our lives, instead of dwelling on day-to-day frustrations.

And certainly, picking up a good Jewish book can be refreshing, and offer new insights into our tradition, linking us to a religious community that has continued to adapt and find meaning within our beautiful faith. ## Long Island Ducks Fundraiser Update

Through the first two full months of Ducks baseball B'nai Israel has had an opportunity to work concession stands at three sold-out Saturday night fireworks nights and has averaged over \$1,500 in income on each occasion.

Three more Saturday nights are scheduled in the month of July and our profit is limited only by the number of volunteers we can commit to concession management. If you would be available to pitch in on July 1st, 15th or 29th and are willing to give it a try, volunteer (or refer any questions to) <u>ducks@bnai-israel.org</u>. No experience necessary. We welcome potential cashiers and runners as well to help support the cashiers. We report to the stadium in Central Islip at 5:00 PM and work through the evening, generally ending by 9:00 or 9:30 PM. Some stamina is required to keep up with the needs of a sell-out crowd and earn both commissions and tips for the Temple.

Check our weekly Thursday morning announcements for regular Ducks updates and any additional concession opportunities that come along from time to time.

Income earned at Ducks games represents B'nai Israel's most lucrative fund raiser and can exceed all other fund-raising activities combined, given enough volunteers. Please offer to help us if you can. Thanks.
