Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

As I am writing this article, summer vacation just started, and it is difficult to imagine what I will be feeling in August as the Holidays rapidly approach and the school year lurks around the corner. But I'm thinking it's going to be along the lines of, "What happened to Summer break?"

For me this is a subtle yet poignant reminder of what I say all the time: every moment is precious. But how do we really take that to heart? In a moment of crisis, we have all had that thought, yet in the moments of calm between, it is so easy to forget.

So, to find answers, I turned to the sagest source I could think of at my fingertips: Rabbi Google.

Among the many articles and self-help books generated by my search, I found a few repeating themes that resonate within Judaism and my own journey.

Be present.

If you have discovered Facebook, or addictive phone games like myself, you know how hard it can be to be present during unstructured time. Yet, it is worth the effort. Whether it means silencing our electronics on Shabbat or setting limits, there is great value in taking in the world and the people around us.

Scholars like Martin Buber, tout the sacred nature of being fully present. He once wrote, "A great relationship ... breaches the barriers of a lofty solitude, subdues its strict law, and throws a bridge from self-being to self-being across the abyss of dread of the universe."

A great way to be present with us at the congregation, is to join us for our regularly scheduled services or upcoming special events like our Meet, Greet and Eat, which will provide an opportunity to get to know/to be present for other members of our congregation, speed dating style, without the dating. It will take place on August 6th at 9:30 am at Temple. Make sure to let us know ASAP if you plan to come, so that we can ensure that there is enough food.

Learn from mistakes

Sometimes, I feel like everything has to be perfect. But, that simply isn't the case. We learn the most profound lessons from our mistakes no matter how large or small, and that can be far more powerful than getting everything right. Judaism teaches us, especially during this Hebrew month of Elul, to take time to learn from our past mistakes, to make amends and to change our behavior for the better. This is the process of teshuva or returning to our most righteous selves.

To explore these themes more formally, join us for a special Selichot dinner and service on Sept. 9, 2023 (6:30 pm dinner, 8:00 pm service). The evening will kick off the official High Holiday season. This is when the process of repenting (teshuva) throughout the Hebrew month of Elul and beyond will be bolstered with prayers and sacred intentions.

Forgive

In the same vein, while every situation is unique, forgiving those who have harmed us (including ourselves) can be uplifting and healing. Holding on to a grudge can take us to dark places. And why should we let someone with harmful intent take up the valuable space in our heads?

Do what you love

I think that finding time to do what we love, what we truly love, is sometimes very difficult. We have many responsibilities, but even if we find just a 15 – 30 minutes a day to do something we truly love, it can be hugely gratifying.

Jewish scholars and practitioners have been modeling this behavior throughout time by clinging to the activities that they love and cherish, including arguing, laughing, eating and celebrating.

Our Temple will be hosting an event that I personally love, a Family Picnic Shabbat on August 11th, at 6:00 pm. It brings us outside and offers the perfect forum for a multigenerational experience under the stars (or most likely just the evening sky). Laughing, eating, and celebrating will be encouraged. No arguing required.

Recognize the blessings in your life

During shabbat services I sometimes ask people to share a highlight of their week, a blessing. I love it when we have time to do this, because not only do I, and all those present, get to hear about the wonders happening in everyone's lives but also because it is a reminder to think about them, to acknowledge that we in fact have blessings in our lives, and that it is important to take them in. The Jewish sages remind us to say 100 blessings a day. This helps us to keep gratitude and thankfulness in our consciousness.

It is so easy to get pulled in the frustrations of life: the battles we feel we've lost, the health challenges that are out of our control, and the changes being made in the world that are unjust and harmful.

And while it isn't healthy to ignore these realities, if they are the only thoughts that occupy our mind, they can take away from that mantra of making the most of the precious moments we have.

Be generous to others

There is nothing more warm and fuzzy than being able to make a difference in someone's life. Whether through a kind word, active helping hand, listening ear, or a sympathetic hug our actions have the ability to make a real difference.

And for some make a difference in the world, especially in the face of the injustices we find more of each and every day can be incredibly holy, healing and meaningful.

Judaism is full of famous dictums that support these efforts. We are commanded to love your neighbor as yourself, to provide for the widow and orphan, to act justly, to heal the world through tikkun olam and on and on. Along with the personal benefits we might feel from participating in these sacred endeavors, these mitzvot remind us that it is the Jewish thing to do.

Tend to your spirituality

August is the perfect month to take stock of our spirituality. It is right before the High Holy Days and gives us time to reflect and set goals for the coming year. Perhaps there is an avenue of Judaism at Temple that you might want to renew. We are constantly exploring new ideas and visions of what it means to be Jewish and look forward to seeing you in the coming year to be part of it.

If any one of these seven strategies can aid us in our task for more meaning, awareness and presence, they are certainly worthy of our time.

May we work to make many precious moments and memories throughout the month of August and beyond! Hoping to see you soon.

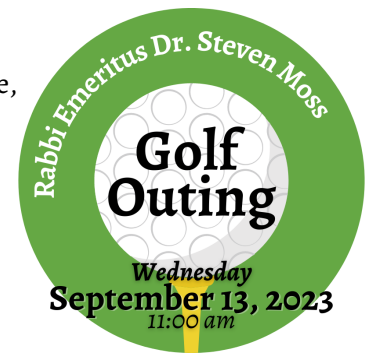
Steve Sonkin was a lifelong member of B'nai Israel Reform Temple, a Past President, and a beloved friend to all.

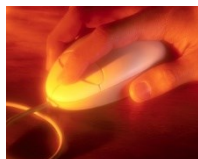

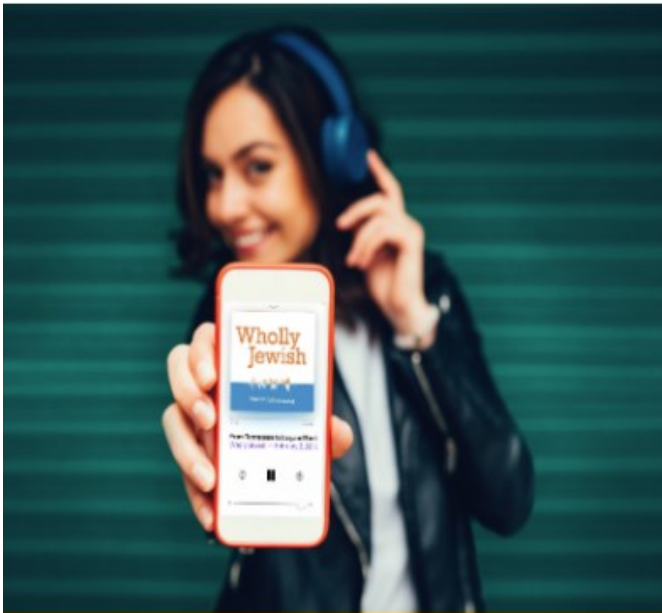

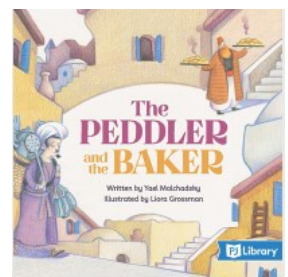
