Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

Happy (secular) New Year! While it seems that I just talked about becoming our best selves during the High Holidays, January is often another time when we consider resolutions, think about what we want to accomplish, and we make plans to get a handle on our bad habits. Certainly, many of us participate in this renewing ritual and it has great value.

Interestingly in Judaism, New Year's isn't limited to the secular New Year and Rosh Hashanah. In fact, according to the Mishnah (an ancient legal code and text) Rosh Hashanah is joined by 3 other celebrations to make a total of 4 times in a year that we celebrate the beginning of a specific time of year. Rosh Hashanah is the New Year for the creation of the world. This is the most well-known Jewish New Year. Tu B'shevat is the New Year of the trees. It signifies a time when

the sap has begun to rise and the fruit begins to ripen. Today, it is celebrated as a Jewish environmental day honoring trees and the earth. It often takes place in the month of January. The third Jewish New Year is 1 Nisan. This is the New Year of redemption and signifies our peoples' freedom from Egypt and the birth of the Israelite nation after receiving the Torah at Mount Sinai. Finally, there is 1 Elul. This is the New Year of the animals or for Tithing cattle.

While we do not always highlight these various New Year markers, there is great wisdom in acknowledging that there are several aspects of our lives that benefit from renewal throughout the year as opposed to just the beginning of the year.

I think that Rosh Hashanah and Tu B'shevat are 2 New Years that speak loudly to our responsibilities to improve our relationships with friends and families and to consider our personal responsibility to care for the earth.

But have the other New Years become too distant to reclaim?

Could there be a New Years to celebrate our birth as a Jewish people, like 1 Nisan in which we take time to celebrate our past and plan our future Jewish observances?

Could there be a New Years for our special connection to our animal friends that we take a step further and really think about how to create better and safer realities for all animals?

Or should we consider adding in a few additional New Year's celebrations to help us renew and consider other aspects of our lives?

Could there be a New Years to inspire us to aid the ills of the world?

Could we work to become an antiracist (being an antiracist is fighting against racism), and start on shabbat tzedek (the shabbat of Martin Luther King Jr. weekend)?

Could we commit to fighting antisemitism through educating friends and neighbors?

Could we commit to aiding Israel in finding her way towards a sustainable and healthy peace, security and just society in which democracy and inclusion prevail?

Or is there another issue that keeps you up at night that could benefit from your expertise and time?

Could there be a B'nai Israel Reform Temple New Years/or Jewish Synagogue New Years?

Could we volunteer a little to help out?

Could we join a committee and brainstorm new ideas?

Is there a friend or neighbor we could bring to Temple?

Could we introduce ourselves to some folks we don't know too well?

Could we come in person to a service or event we have always wanted to come to?

Perhaps a self-care and renewal New Years would also be impactful.

We could take some time to commit to mental and physical well-being.

We could take some time to rest.

We could take some time to learn – or to finally find a group for an activity we have always wanted to do but never

found the time to do so.

What would your creative New Years celebrations be?
When would you add them into your calendar and why?

Judaism reminds us that the cycle of the seasons, can serve as a beautiful and holy reminder of what might help us become fulfilled and healthy human beings throughout the year.

Let's take this special month of January to plan a year full of reminders and times for renewal that we find to be essential and just.

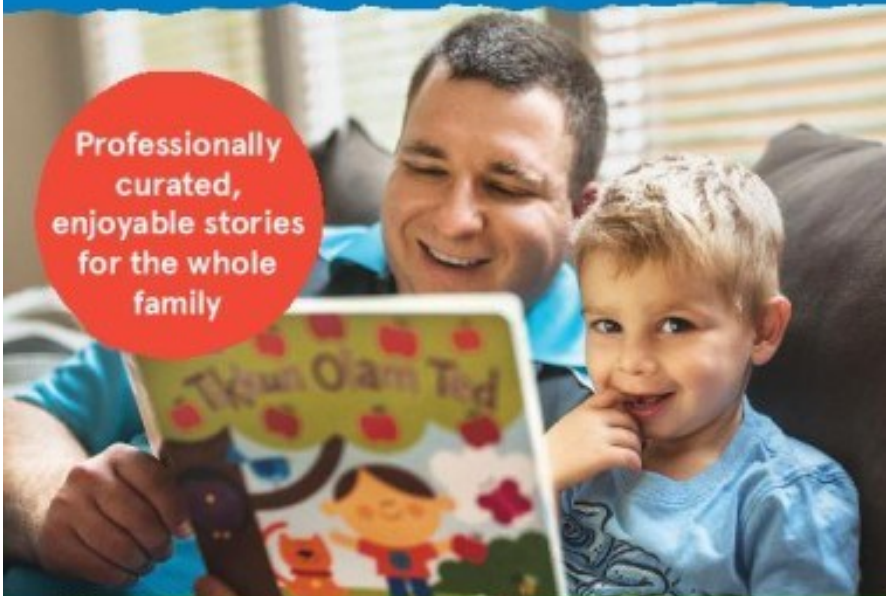

I hope the start of the New Year is bringing everyone a new outlook for 2024. Hoping for good health, happiness and peace for all.

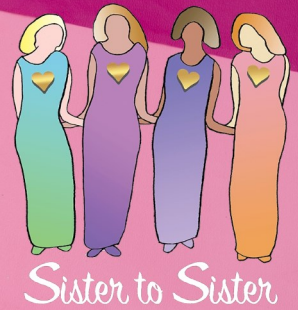

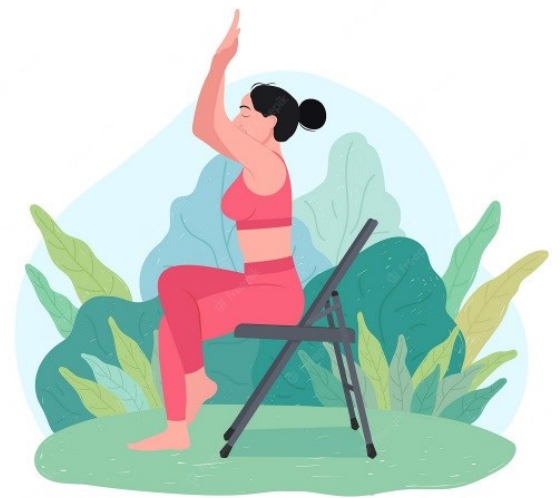

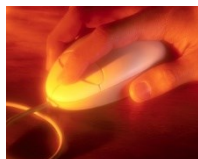
