Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

I remember how shocked I was when I went to a secular school event and saw a couple of plates of hamantaschen out next to the punch and refreshments. To the organizers, they weren't trying to add anything religious to their celebration. Rather, they had just gone to Costco and purchased some cookies that were on sale. But for me, these cookies are deeply related to our Purim celebration and felt somehow out of place in this context.

Interestingly though, hamantaschen were not always attached to the holiday. Like most Jewish foods, hamantaschen developed over time. *Megillat Esther* does tell us to have a festive feast to celebrate the holiday. But it doesn't specify what we should eat. And it certainly doesn't mention triangular cookies filled with chocolate, prunes, apricots, or poppy seeds.

It's not until an Italian Purim play from the 1500's that we first hear about the famous cookies. At the time, they were called *oznei haman*, Haman's ears, which is also the name that is still used in Israel today. In the play, the writer makes fun of rabbis who always root new traditions in biblical text to give them more weight. And so, they jokingly link *oznei haman* with manna from God given to the Israelites in the desert as a hyperbolic example.

These early versions of hamantaschen, according to at least one source, are more likely to have been twisted strips of dough flavored with lemon or orange rind and fried in oil rather than the three-cornered pastries we eat today.

It's possible that *oznei haman* were merged with the 18th century *mohntaschen* (Yiddish for poppy seed pockets) that were renamed hamantaschen as a fun riff on the name.

Later traditions linked the cookies to Haman's hat due to the tricornered hats that people wore in early modern European fashion, like those worn during the American Revolution.

The most interesting thing about them for me, though, is that they have become linked to the idea in the story of blotting out Haman, or wickedness. The reason that we make noise whenever we hear Haman's name in the megillah is that we are supposed to blot out evil. As Haman wanted to destroy us, we eat hamantaschen as a way to remind us of the importance of fighting evil.

Jews today still face forces that would like to see us destroyed. When we eat a hamantaschen, we not only enjoy a treat, we say with confidence that we will not stand for anti-semitism and hatred in the world, taking back a little control by celebrating a treasured custom.

May we take in every opportunity we have to celebrate this holiday of triumph over evil in every way possible: at the Purim Service (March 22nd) where we will hear the megillah and integrate a little silliness into the mix, at our Purim carnival (March 23rd) where we will celebrate our kids and their capacity to find fun wherever they are, and during the masquerade (March 23rd) where we will dance the night away. Each experience will offer us the chance to enjoy a hamantaschen. And no matter where we might see this special cookie, let's remember its unique history and call in the world to fight against any evil we may encounter.

Wishing everyone a Purim sameach, a happy and sweet Purim celebration!

Dear B'nai Israel Member/Friend,

With the arrival of spring, (soon!) comes baseball, and close to home that means another season of Long Island Ducks baseball at the stadium in Central Islip.

And with that, comes our Temple's opportunity to work at various Ducks concession stands and earn commissions and tips for B'nai Israel. **Our annual Ducks fund-raising activity is the most successful and profitable opportunity we have to contribute much-needed income to the General Fund.** Ducks income is exceeded only by dues and donations, and with enough volunteers, could replace donations as the second largest source of income in support of the Temple. Better yet, this fund-raiser incurs no expense to us. It's all profit and money that doesn't come out of the pockets of our members and friends.

There is no cap to what we can earn! It all depends on how many volunteers step up to do the work! And to be successful, WE NEED HELP! Our games will be Wednesday and Saturday evenings this season. (Saturday nights feature fire-works, are typically sell-outs, and are the most profitable games by far.) We report at 5:00 PM to set-up for a 6:30 game and work straight through to clean-up. A certain amount of stamina is needed. Our "take" is 10% of register sales plus tips, which can be significant. In addition to cashiers, "runners" to assist in filling orders are helpful and increase profit. Training for first-timers can be completed on-the-job prior to game-time and is all that is needed to become a pro.

B'nai Israel's contract with the Ducks has been signed. A schedule for the 2024 season is available online by clicking [here](#). What remains to be done, is a successful search for volunteers. Many return year after year. We are grateful and we welcome them back. But income is limited to how many cash registers we can handle, and we are hoping to add many new faces to the Temple's team. Volunteers must be 16 years old. (Students will earn community service credit for each game they work.) No one is expected to work more than a game a week, and most work much less often. **Enough volunteers working even a few games a season would spread the workload and make a huge financial impact.**

Ducks concession income is built into the General Fund budget and the Temple cannot manage without it. It has never been as important to our financial well-being as it is today. If you and your extended family members can help, please contact us at ducks@bnai-israel.org for more information or to volunteer.


