### Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

This past month, I attended the Central Conference of Americans Rabbis' (CCAR) Convention in Philadelphia, PA.

The conference is a time to meet new colleagues and reunite with old friends, to learn from experts in the field, to get a sense on the pulse of the American congregation's interests, challenges and passions and how to best meet them.

This CCAR convention included many diverse workshops, lectures, break out groups and informal discussions. For now, I'd like to share a few snapshots of special moments that impacted me the most.

For our opening program, we visited the Weitzman National Museum and learned from Dr. Lila Corwin Berman. She led us through the complicated history of what it means to be a citizen here in the United States, and how that has changed throughout time. While historians often claim that America has been a place of belonging and acceptance, we learned that this was not always the case. From the state level, there were far more prerequisites to be a citizen. Jews couldn't hold public office without making a Christian oath and there were laws that limited their economic rights. In one particularly frightening case, a Jew was stripped of their citizenship after spending time abroad in Israel.

This lecture reminded me of the fragility of democracy and the power that corrupt individuals have to cause incredibly harmful changes to our freedoms and rights to be citizens. The first Amendment in the Bill of Rights prohibits the federal government from infringing on our rights to practice Judaism, but as history has proven again and again since 1791, we can never take our citizenship for granted.

That evening, we discussed how easy it is for those who hate to take away our freedom and safety. We heard from Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker, the Rabbi in Colleyville, TX who was taken hostage in his synagogue with a few congregants in 2022 because a 44-year-old British Pakistani believed the antisemitic trope that Jews have control over the government, and thought that he could get a terrorist released from custody. Rabbi Cytron-Walker shared a preview of a new documentary about his harrowing tale with never-before-seen footage from inside the synagogue. His wife's testimony was particularly moving. She shared that he had always promised her that she would never be alone and could go first and that the day that he was held hostage he had called to say that he didn't know if he could keep that promise. Many were moved to tears. We then discussed how we could still be welcoming while doing our due vigilance to keep our folks safe through security and security training sessions. This is such an important and ongoing topic for Jewish congregations today.

The next day, I went to the LGBTQ community center in Philadelphia and learned about the history of LGBTQ Philadelphian Jews who fought for their civil rights. There is a life size mural of their protests in the 60's in front of the liberty bell. It was fascinating to hear that the folks who participated in those protests were the ones who started the gay pride parades in NY after Stonewall.

After a general history, some of the folks from the Jewish LGBTQ community shared accounts of how they were

completely excluded from synagogues. As a result, the original LGBTQ only synagogue was formed in 1975. They shared a space with a local reform temple starting in 2005, and finally merged with that same synagogue in 2015. The newly merged synagogue created gender neutral restrooms, affixed rainbow mezzuzot to the entry ways and kept the artifacts from before the merger on the walls of the building. And today they are continuing to explore new ways to create safe spaces of belonging.

On Tuesday, the focus was on a topic that has transformed our communities, our changing relationship to Israel after October 7<sup>th</sup>. The conference did a beautiful job of highlighting and honoring our Israeli Reform rabbinic colleagues throughout the conference. And that night, they led services and shared poetry and personal accounts of their experiences. It's not often we hear direct accounts from colleagues, and their words were powerful, emotional and included strong words for the return of the hostages yet also hopes for the end of the fighting.

Rabbi Oded Mazor (the Rabbi of Kol HaNeshama) wrote a prayer for the beginning of Adar (a traditionally joyful time). He said, "May it be Your will that we are able to hold together the diverse needs within one community to cry and to laugh, mourn and to dance, to celebrate as always to sit in silence. May it be Your will... that we witness a turning reality in a new direction; not of killing, fighting and destruction, but of salvation demanding goodness, words of peace and truth."

Overall, the week was full of highlights, learning, renewal, inspiration, collaboration, and intergenerational dialogue.

I look forward to sharing further gleanings with our lay leader partners as we move forward together.

May learning always be a treasured tool and an asset that informs, challenges us and feeds our souls.


Fox's Ubet Chocolate Syrup to make egg creams and many other wonderful desserts.






