Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

Shalom congregational family,

I wanted to say thank you for my sabbatical time. It makes all the difference in the world to have a moment to learn, think, try new things and visit interests that I have not had the time to pursue. I took art classes, read books, took guitar lessons, exercised, gardened, met with rabbis, attended services and retreats in other communities, and more. So. I am going to try to shake things up a bit. Just a little. This will not be your Bubbe's Sisterhood. Will you join us?

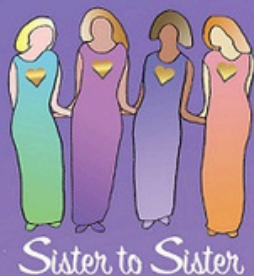
