JOIN RABBI ROSENTHAL FOR TORAH STUDY AND ADULT EDUCATION ON THE 11TH AND 25TH

Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

During our Shabbat service on January 17th, we will celebrate Shabbat Tzedek, a shabbat of righteousness that honors Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy.

As I was beginning to prepare for this special shabbat, I came across the following teaching, that offers inspiration and a meaningful charge for not only that specific shabbat, but also for the secular New Year.

Dr. King writes,

"Courage is an inner resolution to go forward despite obstacles."

Cowardice is submissive surrender to circumstances.

Courage breeds creativity; Cowardice represses fear and is mastered by it.

Cowardice asks the question, is it safe?

Expediency asks the question, is it politic?

Vanity asks the question, is it popular?

But, conscience asks the question, is it right?"

Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Radio Broadcast, KPFA, Santa Rita CA, January 14, 1968.

What I love about this quote is that Dr. King's call to courage is not about grandios action but rather grounding ourselves in what is right, especially when it is neither easy nor convenient.

To me, this is the heart of Judaism.

To be Jewish is to seek to be righteous. There is the famous story about A potential convert once asked Rabbi Hillel to be taught the whole Torah while his teacher stood on one foot. Rabbi Hillel responded, "What is hateful to you, do not do to your fellow. The rest [of Torah] is commentary—go and study." Just as Rabbi Hillel teaches us, the way we treat others, partner with them, ally with them, and stand up with them is at the heart of our tradition. Our prayers can be understood in this way as well. Jewish prayers remind us of what a perfect world- one which is full of peace, blessing and gratitude, looks like. This stands in stark contrast to divisions, inequities and intolerance that exist in the real world. Recognizing this juxtaposition is a powerful motivator to make change, holding fast to doing what is right.

Social justice is deeply woven into Judaism. We are called to love the stranger as ourself and affirm that people of color matter and are holy, created in the image of God. We stand firmly in our commitment to ally with all oppressed peoples to create a more just and equitable system.

Even our holidays reflect this ethic. Many mitzvot or commandments oblige us to include righteous and communal acts. We invite guests to our festive meals, give tzedakah right before shabbat and during the High Holy Days, send mishloach manot to friends and give gifts to the poor on Purim, and welcome guests to the Passover seder and our Sukkot meals.

As we enter the secular New Year, tzedek, or righteousness is an essential and powerful kavanah or intention to guide us. May we pursue justice together by honoring Dr. King's legacy and lifting up our Jewish principles with love and passion, always keeping in mind what is right.

In fact, the holidays never are early or late; they are always on time, according to the Jewish calendar. Unlike the Gregorian (civil) calendar, which is based on the sun, the Jewish calendar is based primarily on the moon, with adjustments made for the differences between the solar and lunar cycles. In 2026, we will see Rosh Hashanah on 9/11 and in 2027 we will share Hanukkah and Christmas Eve.




