Rabbi Rosenthal's Message

Each year, we reread the torah. Not because we are forgetful or haven't learned it well enough the first time, but instead, because each year, we are different. Each year, we look at the same words with a new set of eyes, new life experiences, and a new world around us. A seemingly mundane passage last year, could become deeply meaningful this year.

The same holds for our holiday celebrations. While the rituals and some of the prayers remain the same,what we emphasize in our holiday celebrations, changes as we do. This is what helps to keeps them meaningful and relevant.



This month, we celebrate Purim. And as we begin to plan, I can't help but contemplate the holiday and what it means for us this year. Lately, I have been thinking about the masks we wear, and the necessity we feel to hide who we are in the face of hatred and intolerance. In the Purim story, our heroine Esther doesn't tell King Ahasuerus that she is Jewish. And when it becomes necessary for her to do so, she is understandably fearful, because she knows that the king could have her killed. Yet she persists and reveals her true self to the King. In the process of doing so, she saves our people from Haman who wishes to have all the Jews murdered.

As someone who's Hebrew name is Esther, I have always connected with her as a character. And this year, I find extra resonance with her narrative. It is scary to reveal who we are, and what we believe because we don't know that it is safe to do so. Will someone respond with ignorance, support, or violent rhetoric? Yet, I know in my heart of hearts that it is important to do so, because it is worth fighting to live in a world where we can be our true selves; where masks are not necessary.

With antisemitism on the rise once more and hatred and cruel laws being cultivated against transgender Americans, refugees, and immigrants, it can be difficult and scary to share who we are. And it can be difficult to be in spaces where we can't be our full selves.

This Purim, I hope that our costumes will not hide us but lift up our values and highlight characters and traits that we admire. May we honor characters who promote hope, love, tolerance and a fighting spirit.

In addition to being true to myself, I commit to helping to make sure that B'nai Israel remains a safe place where we can be loved for our differences, and unique, God given characteristics.

We hope that you'll join us for one of our many Purim themed events- costumes are welcomed but not required at all: our masquerade on March 8th for adults, and for all ages, our Purim Service on March 14th (complete with mini megillah reading and costume parade) and our Purim carnival on March 15th.


Outreach Committee - Alice Lambert






Dynamic Chair Yoga with Bonnie Rubell

Spring is here, almost. But spring training is already underway. And baseball is back for the 2025 season. We have a handshake with the Long Island Ducks and B'nai Israel volunteers will be back at the stadium in Central Islip working at concession stands to earn commissions and tips for our Temple.

We've met with new concession management and discussed changes to our annual contract which is still being reviewed but expected to be finalized shortly. We will be working home-games on Wednesday and Saturday evenings beginning on opening weekend, Saturday evening, April 26th. A Ducks schedule is included in this month's mailing and is available online by <u>clicking here</u>.

In past years the income from working at Ducks games has exceeded the total earned by all other Temple fundraising efforts combined and is an essential part of the General Fund annual budget. There is no expense involved and no cap to our earning ability, which is limited only by the number of volunteers we can provide. While many of our volunteers work with us year after year, attrition is always an issue, and more help is always needed. In addition to cashiers, we need runners to help fill customer orders. No experience is needed. Training for first-timers is onthe-job and typically can be completed by game time.

But the jobs are demanding and typically require the physical stamina to work on our feet for about five consecutive hours.

Volunteers must be 16 years old with working papers. Students will earn community service credit for each game and are among our most productive workers. We also give high marks to volunteers into their 80's and have had three generations of a Temple family working a concession together at one time. All who are able are encouraged to pitch-in. No one expected to work more than one game a week. Some do, but many work much less often. Every volunteer at every game contributes and their work is appreciated by the Ducks as well as B'nai Israel.
